A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to a study of the efficiency and effectiveness of
2 economic-development-related, workforce-development-related,
3 and business-inspection-related programs administered by the
4 state.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT
2 STUDY.

3 1. The department of economics at Iowa state university of
4 science and technology shall conduct a study of all economic-
5 development-related and workforce-development-related programs
6 administered by state agencies, the funding of such programs,
7 and any programs administered by a state agency which include
8 as a part of the programs any inspection of a business. The
9 department of economics shall also examine the duties and
10 responsibilities of any relevant state authority, board,
11 commission, committee, council, or department and any subunits
12 of such entities.

13 2. By December 15, 2002, the department of economics shall
14 submit a report to the general assembly which includes, at a
15 minimum, all of the following:

16 a. Recommendations regarding, at a minimum, all of the
17 following:

18 (1) How economic-development-related, workforce-
19 development-related, and business-inspection-related programs
20 can be simplified.

21 (2) How any duplication of economic-development-related,
22 workforce-development-related, and business-inspection-related
23 programs can be eliminated.

24 (3) How economic-development-related, workforce-
25 development-related, and business-inspection-related programs
26 can be coordinated in an efficient manner which would allow
27 persons seeking assistance to contact one person in order to
28 receive all necessary information and assistance.

29 (4) Whether each individual economic-development-related,
30 workforce-development-related, and business-inspection-related
31 program is viable, whether each program is assisting in the
32 creation of jobs, and whether each program is providing
33 effective and efficient assistance to small businesses in this
34 state.

35 b. Identification of the relevant state authorities,

1 boards, commissions, committees, councils, and departments,
2 and any subunits of such entities that administer economic-
3 development-related, workforce-development-related, and
4 business-inspection-related programs.

5 c. A mission statement and indicator of success for each
6 economic-development-related, workforce-development-related,
7 and business-inspection-related program.

8 3. By August 1, 2002, the legislative fiscal bureau shall
9 submit information to the department of economics at Iowa
10 state university of science and technology regarding the
11 funding sources, the full-time equivalent positions used, and
12 the amounts of moneys received by state agencies for economic-
13 development-related, workforce-development-related, and
14 business-inspection-related programs.

15 4. The appropriate standing committees of the Eightieth
16 General Assembly shall consider the recommendations of the
17 report filed by the department of economics at Iowa state
18 university of science and technology in order to determine any
19 changes necessary to accomplish a more efficient and effective
20 manner of providing economic development, workforce
21 development, and business inspection assistance.

22 EXPLANATION

23 This bill relates to a study of the efficiency and
24 effectiveness of economic development, workforce development,
25 and business inspection programs administered by the state.
26 The bill provides that the department of economics at Iowa
27 state university of science and technology shall conduct the
28 study. The bill provides that the study shall include an
29 examination of all economic-development-related and workforce-
30 development-related programs administered by a state agency,
31 funding of such programs, and any program administered by a
32 state agency which includes as a part of the program an
33 inspection of a business. The bill provides that the
34 department of economics shall also examine the duties and
35 responsibilities of any relevant state authority, board,

1 commission, committee, council, or department, and any
2 subunits of such entities.

3 The bill provides that, by December 15, 2002, the
4 department of economics shall submit a report to the general
5 assembly which includes recommendations regarding how
6 economic-development-related, workforce-development-related,

31 equivalent positions used, and the amounts of moneys received
32 by state agencies for economic-development-related, workforce-
33 related, and business-inspection-related programs.

34 The bill provides that appropriate standing committees of
35 the Eightieth General Assembly shall consider the

1 recommendations of the report filed by the department of
2 economics in order to determine any changes necessary to
3 accomplish a more efficient and effective manner of providing
4 economic development, workforce development, and business
5 inspection assistance.
