

Health First Colorado Buy-In Program For Working Adults With Disabilities

The Health First Colorado Buy-In Program for Working Adults with Disabilities lets adults with a disability who qualify to "buy-into" Health First Colorado (Colorado's Medicaid Program). If you work and earn too much to qualify for Health First Colorado you may qualify. If you qualify, you pay a monthly premium. Your monthly premium is based on your gross monthly earned and unearned income after any applicable disregards.

Who qualifies?

- You must be between 16 or older,
- You must be employed,
- You must have a qualifying disability, either through Social Security or the State Disability Determination vendor, even if you are 65 or older. The <u>Social Security Administration (SSA) listings</u> (<u>https://www.ssa.gov/disability/professionals/bluebook/</u>)</u> describe what disabilities qualify, and
- Your income after disregards must be below 450% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). For example, you can earn about \$11,020 a month and qualify. You may have additional income that is disregarded.
- Applicants should always complete the <u>Health First Colorado Application (/how-to-apply)</u> to find out if their income qualifies.

You are not required to apply for SSA disability. If you do not have a current disability determination from the Social Security Administration, fill out the <u>Health First Colorado Disability Application (/how-to-apply#by-mail)</u> and on the <u>How To Apply page (/how-to-apply#by-mail)</u>. We will determine if you qualify using the <u>Social Security</u> <u>Administration (SSA) listings (https://www.ssa.gov/disability/professionals/bluebook/)</u>, without regard to your substantial gainful activity or your ability to work.

Benefits and Services

You will get regular <u>Health First Colorado benefits (https://www.healthfirstcolorado.com/benefits-services/)</u>. You may also qualify for extra long-term services and supports. These additional services are accessed through the following Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) waivers:

What Does It Cost?

You have to pay monthly premiums based on your income to be in the program. The more you make, the more you pay.

Effective Date: April 1, 2023 based on 2023 FPL

Federal Poverty Level (FPL)	Monthly Income for an Individual	You Pay Each Month
0-40%	\$0- \$486*	\$0
41-133%	\$487 - \$1,616*	\$25
134-200%	\$1,617 - \$2,430*	\$90
201-300%	\$2,431 - \$3,645*	\$130
301-450%	\$3,646 - \$5,468*	\$200

*Some people earning more may still qualify.

How to Apply

- Complete Medical application online at <u>Colorado.gov/PEAK (https://www.colorado.gov/peak)</u>
 - If you apply through PEAK and you do not have a current disability determination from the Social Security Administration, you must fill out the <u>Health First Colorado Disability Application (/how-to-apply#by-mail)</u> on the <u>How To Apply page (/how-to-apply#by-mail)</u> and submit it to your eligibility determination site.
