Iowas reckless driving standard is higher than just about anywhere else in the country, at times leaving excessive speed resulting in the death of another as a simple misdemeanor traffic violation. According to NHTSA, speedrelated deaths increased 4% in 2016, while deaths caused by drunk drivers increased only 1.7%.
