I write on behalf of NSSF in strong support of House Study Bill 609.

NSSF has worked for years to increase participation in hunting, gun ownership, and the shooting sports through R3 efforts. "R3" stands for Recruit, Retain and Reactivate. Today, NSSF leads R3 initiatives that include National Shooting Sports Month, +One, First Shots, #LetsGoShooting, and #LetsGoHunting, just to name a few. The continued effort by our companies and others in the industry to recruit, retain and reactivate hunters is important to us and included in our mission statement. Youth and others headed afield in Iowa would benefit from being allowed to utilize sub-gauge shotgun options. Offering hunters, the ability to take advantage of advances in shotshell technology promotes two key priorities: the ethical harvest of turkeys, including reductions in wound loss, and second, opening the door to new and young hunters. These firearm choices offer smaller statured hunters with reduced recoil options and paired with products such as Tungsten Super Shot (TSS) or Bismuth, allow for a memorable, ethical harvest.

For the reasons listed above, our ammunition businesses support HSB 609 to allow the use of .410 bore and other sub-gauge shotguns for turkey hunting. We also urge the Committee to address the current shot size restrictions currently within the IA DNR regulations. The use of Tungsten and other high-density shot options are not only non-toxic selections, but the technology and performance of the high-density shot also offer a more ethical harvest when choosing to use sub-gauge firearms. We have provided suggested language to current regulations, here:

The only legal firearms for turkey hunting are: shotguns and muzzleloader shotguns <del>not</del> smaller than 20-gauge 10 gauge or smaller shooting shot size number 4 or smaller number 4 through 8 lead or nontoxic shot. Hunters may not have shot sizes other than number 4 through 8 on their person while hunting turkeys. Muzzleloading rifles may not be used to hunt turkeys.

Thank you for your consideration of HSB 609 and the inclusion of the shot size concerns outlined above. Hunting is experiencing a resurgence in activity, and corresponding increases in

the Pittman Robertson Wildlife Conservation Fund are advancing the state-based model of conservation is significant ways.
