I. Procedural Business

Call to Order. The third meeting of the 2009-2010 Legislative Council was called to order by Chairperson Kibbie at 12:25 p.m., Friday, March 26, 2010, in Room 24, State Capitol, Des Moines, Iowa.

Minutes of Prior Meetings. Senator Danielson moved that the minutes of the meeting of March 1, 2010, be approved without additions or corrections. The motion was approved by a voice vote.

Adjournment. The meeting was adjourned at 12:31 p.m.

II. Consideration of Motion Relating to the Meetings and Authority of the Committees on Government Oversight

Chairperson Kibbie recognized Senator Gronstal who moved that the Legislative Council authorize the standing Committees on Government Oversight to jointly hold three meeting days during the 2010 Interim, with any additional meeting days as approved by legislative leadership, to conduct an investigation, issue subpoenas, and take other appropriate actions relating to the Iowa Association of School Boards, in accordance with but not limited to the authority granted standing committees in Iowa Code Sections 2.15 and 2.23.

In response to a query by Representative Paulsen, Senator Gronstal stated that the motion does not include investigation of the Film Office within the Iowa Department of Economic Development and the financial assistance provided under the Film, Television, and Video Project Promotion Program because the Film Office and program are the subject of an ongoing criminal investigation by the Iowa Attorney General.

The motion was adopted by voice vote.

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
