## MINUTES OF THE JULY 2006 MEETING OF THE

## ADMINISTRATIVE RULES REVIEW COMMITTEE

Convened Chair Eichhorn convened the meeting at 9 a.m.

Mary Beth Mellick presented the LSA report on rule makings that may have a Fiscal report

significant fiscal impact.

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT Carol Greta and Max Christensen represented the department.

No questions on proposed ch 24 concerning community college accreditation. ARC 5135B

ARC 5236B No action on proposed amendments to ch 44 regarding school buses. These

amendments are the result of the most thorough review of the rules in seven years.

EDUCATIONAL EXAMINERS BOARD George Mauer and Beth Myers represented the board. Linda

Goeldner represented the Iowa Nurses Association. Other interested parties included

Charlotte Burt.

ARC 5157B No action on proposed 14.140(11) concerning the statement of professional recognition

(SPR) available from the board of educational examiners for nurses licensed by the lowa nursing board and employed by school districts. Ms. Goeldner commented that the national association would prefer that the SPR be reserved for nurses with a bachelor's degree (BSN), but the association does not want to prevent the rule from going forward. Ms. Burt recommended requiring a BSN degree for the SPR and

presented a list of duties that require the expertise of BSNs.

ARC 5185B

No action of 15.3 to 15.20 regarding special education endorsements. Discussion related to the use of the word "political" in 15.14(2); Ms. Myers explained the context and noted that the word also appeared in the former provisions. Rep. Frevert commented that the new orientation and mobility specialist rule was thorough and

STATE PUBLIC DEFENDER Mark Smith represented the office of state public defender.

ARC 5267B No questions on amendments to chs 7, 12, and 14.

PHARMACY EXAMINERS BOARD Lloyd Jessen and Terry Witkowski represented the board. Other

interested parties included Richard Savage of the Iowa Association of Pathologists and

Jeanine Freeman of the Iowa Medical Society.

ARC 5150B No questions on amendments pertaining to licensure, registration and permit fees.

The board of medical examiners and the pharmacy examiners board have adopted rules ARC 5151B

on collaborative drug therapy management. Dr. Savage contended that there is no statutory basis for the rule. Ms. Freeman expressed concern about the lack of statutory authority for a rule which allows a pharmacist to conduct laboratory work in a

community practice setting under the supervision of a physician.

Motion to refer Kibbie moved a referral to the appropriate committee of the General Assembly.

Motion carried The motion carried; rule 8.34 was referred to the General Assembly.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT Barb Nervig and Kimberly Piper represented the department.

ARC 5178B No comments on proposed amendments to ch 4 concerning the neonatal metabolic

screening program.

ARC 5129B No questions on amendments to ch 42 regarding radiologist assistants.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION COMMISSION Jim McGraw, Christine Paulson, Diane Moles,

Dennis Alt and Matt McDonald represented the commission. Other interested parties

included Jack Clark of the Iowa Utility Association.

ARC 5154B No questions on proposed amendments to chs 20 and 22 and proposed new ch 33

pertaining to air quality.

ARC 5139B Ms. Paulson presented the amendments to ch 22 and new ch 34 concerning the clean

air interstate rule (CAIR) and the air quality emissions trading program. Discussion related to the impact on 29 utilities in Iowa. Mr. Clark commended EPC for their

work on this program.

ARC 5140B No action on the clean air mercury rule (CAMR). Members expressed concern about

excessive mercury and the need for mitigation.

ARC 5155B No questions on amendments related to water use and water allocation program.

ARC 5149B No questions on amendments to provide for composting of dead livestock. NATURAL RESOURCE COMMISSION Terry Little, Kevin Szcodronski, Martin Conrad, and Kurt Hanson represented the commission. No action on the amendment to remove the Iowa River Corridor Area in Iowa County ARC 5148B from the list of wildlife refuges. No questions on proposed cabin rental fees in Waubonsie State Park. ARC 5141B ARC 5143B No action on amendments to ch 82 pertaining to shovelnose sturgeon. ARC 5147B No action on amendments to ch 98 concerning wild turkey spring hunting. No questions on proposed amendments to ch 99 regarding wild turkey fall hunting by ARC 5146B residents. ARC 5142B No action on proposed amendments to ch 105 concerning deer population management zones and penalties for violating regulations. No action on the bag limit for jackrabbit hunting. ARC 5145B Mr. Little reported that 75% of the comments received supported amendments to ch ARC 5144B 108 regarding trapping of river otter; Mr. Royce noted that five out of the six comments he received opposed the amendments. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT Melanie Johnson and Ken Boyd represented the department. Chs 311 to 313 implement the renewable fuel infrastructure board and programs. ARC 5160B Following discussion about the composition of the board, Mr. Royce agreed to draft a letter to the department and a general referral for the committee's review at the August meeting. The minutes of the June 2006 meeting were approved. Committee business The next meeting will be held Tuesday, August 8, 2006. If there is a need for a two-day meeting, it will be held Monday, August 7 and Tuesday, August 8. INSURANCE DIVISION Roseanne Mead represented the division. Proposed amendments to ch 15 pertain to annuity transactions. Ms. Mead indicated ARC 5173B that the amendments will result in full disclosure and greater oversight of sales practices. Mr. Royce will forward to the division a Medicaid rule involving annuities. REVENUE DEPARTMENT David Casey represented the department. No questions on proposed amendments to chs 38 to 40, 45, 46, 48 to 50, 52, 54, 56, ARC 5177B 58, 59, 61, 86, and 89. No action on amendments to ch 42 concerning the child and dependent care tax credit ARC 5176B and early childhood development tax credit. SOIL CONSERVATION DIVISION Ken Tow represented the division. No action on amendments to ch 11 regarding the conservation practices revolving loan ARC 5175B HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT Nancy Freudenberg and Carol Eaton represented the department. Kristie Oliver represented the Iowa Association of Homes and Services for the Aging. Bernie Nesbit was also present. Ms. Freudenberg reported that these amendments concerning Medicaid eligibility for ARC 5134B persons receiving long-term care services will bring the Medicaid rules into compliance with the Deficit Reduction Act of 2005. Rep. Heaton noted that one-third of the the persons in long-term care will be affected. Discussion related to how the fair market value of annuities will be determined and concerns for the community spouse. No questions on the amendment to exclude drugs used to treat sexual dysfunction from ARC 5132B Medicaid coverage. No questions on proposed amendments to ch 92 concerning the IowaCare program. ARC 5153B Amendments to ch 98 pertain to child support obligations. Mr. Nesbit provided written ARC 5131B comments and voiced opposition to the amendments, which do not address delinquency due to unemployment.
