Chair Baudler called the meeting to order at 10:05PM.

The roll was taken and a quorum was present.

The minutes from the previous meeting were reviewed and were approved by unanimous consent.

Chair Baudler recognized Representative Shaw for opening comments on [HF 2114](#): A bill for an act relating to the murder of a peace officer, reserve peace officer, correctional officer, jailer, public employee, or hostage, and providing penalties. Representative Shaw made opening comments on the bill. As there was an amendment to the bill, Chair Baudler recognized Representative Shaw for consideration of Amendment 2714 to [HF 2114](#). After opening comments on the amendment, Chair Baudler recognized members of the committee for discussion on the amendment. After questions and discussion, Representative Shaw moved Amendment 2714. Amendment 2714 passed unanimously with a voice vote. After discussion on the bill as amended, Representative Shaw made closing comments and moved [HF 2114](#) as amended. [HF 2114](#) as amended passed 20-1 with Representative Anderson voting nay. Having received an affirmative vote of a majority of the committee membership as required to report a bill out of committee, [HF 2114](#) as amended moved to the House Floor as a committee bill.

Chair Baudler recognized Representative Klein for opening comments on [HF 2116](#): A bill for an act prohibiting the disclosure of personal information except under specified circumstances and providing penalties. Representative Klein reserved comments for the bill and requested to move to the amendment. As there was an amendment to the bill, Chair Baudler recognized Representative Klein for consideration of Amendment 2756 to [HF 2116](#). After opening comments on the amendment, Chair Baudler recognized members of the committee for discussion on the amendment. After questions and discussion, Representative Klein moved Amendment 2756. Amendment 2756 passed unanimously with a voice vote. After discussion on the bill as amended, Representative Klein made closing comments and moved [HF 2116](#) as amended. [HF 2116](#) as amended passed 19-2 with Representatives Anderson and Wolfe voting nay. Having received an affirmative vote of a majority of the committee membership as required to report a bill out of committee, [HF 2116](#) as amended moved to the House Floor as a committee bill.

Chair Baudler recognized Representative Brandenburg for opening comments on [HSB 545](#): A study bill relating to emergency management assistance in a disaster emergency concerning emergency personnel and mutual aid arrangements and agreements. Representative Brandenburg made opening comments on the bill. As there was an amendment to the bill, Chair Baudler recognized Representative Brandenburg for consideration of Amendment 2780 to [HSB 545](#). After opening comments on the amendment, Chair Baudler recognized members of the committee for discussion on the amendment. After questions and discussion, Representative Brandenburg moved Amendment 2780. Amendment 2780 passed unanimously with a voice vote. After discussion on the bill as amended, Representative Brandenburg made closing comments and moved [HSB 545](#) as amended. [HSB 545](#) as amended passed unanimously 21-0. Having received an affirmative vote of a majority of the committee membership as required to report a bill out of committee, [HSB 545](#) as amended moved to the House Floor as a committee bill.

Chair Baudler recognized Representative Fry for opening comments on [HSB 546](#): A study bill relating to the possession of precursor substances used to manufacture controlled substances, and providing penalties. Representative Fry made opening comments on the bill. After discussion on the bill, Representative Fry made closing comments and moved [HSB 546](#). [HSB 546](#) passed unanimously 21-0. Having received an affirmative vote of a majority of the committee membership as required to report a bill out of committee, [HSB 546](#) moved to the House Floor as a committee bill.

Chair Baudler recognized Representative Shaw for opening comments on [HSB 595](#): A study bill for establishing a mass notification and emergency messaging system fund. Representative Shaw made opening comments on the bill. As there was an amendment to the bill, Chair Baudler recognized Representative Shaw for consideration of Amendment 2805 to [HSB 595](#). After opening comments on the amendment, Chair Baudler recognized members of the committee for discussion on the amendment. After questions and discussion, Representative Shaw moved Amendment 2805. Amendment 2805 passed unanimously with a voice vote. After discussion on the bill as amended, Representative Shaw made closing comments and moved [HSB 595](#) as amended. [HSB 595](#) as amended passed unanimously 21-0. Having received an affirmative vote of a majority of the committee membership as required to report a bill out of committee, [HSB 595](#) as amended moved to the House Floor as a committee bill.

Chair Baudler asked for unanimous consent to run [HSB 640](#) as it was not on the agenda. With unanimous consent, Chair Baudler recognized Representative Fry for opening comments on [HSB 640](#): A study bill for adding the hallucinogenic substance kratom to the list of schedule I controlled substances, and providing penalties. Representative Fry made opening comments for the bill. After discussion on the bill, Representative Fry made closing comments and moved [HSB 640](#). [HSB 640](#) passed 20-1 with Representative Wolfe voting nay. Having received an affirmative vote of a majority of the committee membership as required to report a bill out of committee, [HSB 640](#) moved to the House Floor as a committee bill.

As there was no additional business to come before the committee, Representative R. Olson moved to adjourn.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:40PM.
