The committee reconvened at 12:30 pm.

The chair asked for and received unanimous consent to send the committee into a subcommittee of the whole to consider [HSB 654](#) (An act relating to continuity for learning for children receiving foster care services) and [HSB 659](#) (An act relating to misconduct under the code of professional conduct and ethics of the board of educational examiners and making penalties applicable). Representative Jorgensen (CH) recognized Representative Fry for opening remarks on [HSB 654](#). After discussion, the chair recognized Representative Fry for closing remarks on [HSB 654](#). Representative Fry moved the bill which passed with a voice vote.

The chair recognized Representative Fry for opening remarks on [HSB 659](#). After discussion, the chair recognized Representative Fry for closing remarks on [HSB 659](#).
