Fry gave opening remarks regarding <u>SF 2330</u>, an Act relating to reimbursement of community mental health centers under the medical assistance program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, and including effective date and retroactive applicability provisions. Following discussion of the bill Rep. Fry moved <u>SF 2330</u>, a voice vote was taken and the bill was moved out of subcommittee.

The Chair moved the subcommittee of the whole move back into full committee, seeing no objections the committee entered into regular committee.

The Chair recognized Rep. Fry for opening remarks regarding SF 2330, an Act relating to reimbursement of community mental health centers under the medical assistance program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, and including effective date and retroactive applicability provisions. Following discussion of the bill Rep. Fry moved SF 2330, a roll call vote was taken. Having received 21 ayes and 0 nays, SF 2330 passed.

The Chair recognized Rep. Heaton for opening remarks regarding SF 2320, an Act relating to
providers of medical assistance program consumer-directed attendant care and consumer
choices option services, including effective date and retroactive applicability provisions, Rep.
Heaton discussed Amendment 2382. With no discussion following Rep. Heaton moved 2382, a
voice vote was taken and the Amendment passed unanimously. Rep. Heaton moved SF 2320,
having received 21 ayes and 0 nays, <u>SF 2320</u> passed.
