After discussion, the Chair recognized Representative Koester for closing remarks on <u>HSB 199</u>. Representative Koester moved <u>HSB 199</u>. The bill passed with a roll call vote of 23 ayes to 0 nays. Having received a constitutional majority, the bill will move to the floor as a committee bill.

The Chair recognized Representative Sieck for opening remarks on HF 462 (An act providing for a waiver of eligibility requirements to receive a high school equivalency diploma). After discussion, the Chair recognized Representative Sieck for closing remarks on HF 462. Representative Sieck moved HF 462. The bill passed with a roll call vote of 23 ayes to 0 nays. Having received a constitutional majority, the bill will move to the floor as a committee bill.
