The meeting came to order at 9:30 AM. The meeting recessed at 9:45 AM and reconvened at 4:00 PM.

All members went to caucus immediately, returning to the meeting at 4:12 PM.

Chair Quirmbach yielded the floor to Senator Schoenjahn. Senator Quirmbach made opening remarks concerning <u>SSB 1239</u>. The Subcommittee for the bill - Senators Quirmbach, Dvorsky, Hart, Schultz, and Sinclair - returned the bill to the Committee without recommendation.

Senator Quirmbach made opening remarks concerning amendment <u>SSB 1239</u>.657. Senator Schoenjahn invited discussion; there was none. A unanimous short form vote passed the amendment.

Senator Bowman commented on <u>SSB 1239</u> as amended and Senator Quirmbach made closing remarks. A unanimous short form vote passed the bill as amended. Rule 40 applied.

Senator Schoenjahn recognized Senator Quirmbach who made opening remarks for <u>SSB</u> 1234 and its amendment <u>SSB</u> 1234.640. Senator Sinclair commented on the amendment. A unanimous short form vote passed the amendment.

Senator Hart commented and Senator Johnson had questions about <u>SSB 1234</u> as amended. Senator Quirmbach made closing remarks. A record vote passed <u>SSB 1234</u> as amended 11-4. Aye votes: Quirmbach, Schoenjahn, Sinclair, Bowman, Dvorsky, Hart, Hogg, Kinney, Kraayenbrink, Mathis, and Wilhelm. Nay votes: Behn, Johnson, Schultz, and Zaun. Rule 40 applied.

Senator Schoenjahn recognized Senator Quirmbach for <u>SSB 1053</u> who made opening remarks on the study bill and its associated amendment <u>SSB 1053</u>.319. Senator Schoenjahn asked for discussion; Senator Sinclair commented. Senator Quirmbach made closing remarks. A record vote passed the amendment 9-6. Aye votes: Quirmbach, Schoenjahn, Bowman, Dvorsky, Hart, Hogg, Kinney, Mathis, & Wilhelm. Nay votes: Sinclair, Behn, Johnson, Kraayenbrink, Schultz, & Zaun. Rule 40 applied.

Amendment <u>SSB 1053.253</u> and <u>its</u> amendment <u>SSB 1053.253.282</u> were deemed out of order.

The Chair was returned to Senator Quirmbach who recognized Senator Hogg for SF 255. Senator Hogg made opening remarks. Senator Quirmbach asked for discussion; there was none. There were no amendments. A record vote passed the bill 11-4. Aye votes: Quirmbach, Schoenjahn, Sinclair, Bowman, Dvorsky, Hart, Hogg, Kinney, Kraayenbrink, Mathis, &

Wilhelm. Nay votes: Behn, Johnson, Schultz, & Zaun.

Senator Hogg made opening remarks on <u>SF 281</u> and its associated amendment <u>SF 281</u>.496. A unanimous short form vote passed the amendment. There were remarks from Senator Hogg & Kraayenbrink and questions from Senator Johnson.

A record vote passed <u>SF 281</u> as amended 13-2. Aye votes: Quirmbach, Schoenjahn, Sinclair, Bowman, Dvorsky, Hart, Hogg, Johnson, Kinney, Kraayenbrink, Mathis, Wilhelm, & Zaun. Nay votes: Behn & Schultz. Rule 40 applied.

Senator Quirmbach recognized Senator Mathis who made opening remarks for <u>SF 356</u>. There were no amendments. There was no discussion. A unanimous short form vote passed the bill. Senator Hart moved to arise at 5:00 PM.
