Chairman Sands recognized Representative L. Miller for opening remarks on <u>HF 94</u>. An Act eliminating a requirement that taxpayers indicate on their tax returns the presence or absence of health care coverage for their dependent children and apply for certain public health care coverage, and including effective date and retroactive applicability provisions.

The chair recognized Representative L. Miller for Amendment 3150. The amendment was moved and passed on short form.

The bill as amended was moved and passed by the vote 25 Aye, 0 Nay and 0 Absent. The bill will move to the House floor as a Ways and Means Committee bill as amended.

Chairman Sands recognized Representative Nunn for opening remarks on HF 2412. An Act relating to the programs and duties of the economic development authority by making changes relative to the use of life cycle cost analyses, by making technical changes related to the high quality jobs program, by making changes relative to authority assistance for certain federal

small business programs, by allowing counties, cities, and the authority to amend certain economic development enterprise zones agreements, and by making changes to the historic preservation and cultural and entertainment district tax credit, including transferring administrative oversight of the tax credit from the department of cultural affairs to the economic development authority, and including effective date provisions.

The chair recognized Representative Nunn for Amendment 3051. The amendment was moved and passed on short form.

The bill as amended was moved and passed by the vote 25 Aye, 0 Nay and 0 Absent. The bill will move to the House floor as a Ways and Means Committee bill as amended.

As there was no additional business to come before the committee Representative Baltimore moved to adjourn at 1:44 PM.
