- Chairman Holt recognized Representative Baxter for opening remarks on [HF 182](#). An Act authorizing the adjutant general of Iowa to waive certain requirements and limitations of the National Guard educational assistance program under certain conditions. The bill was moved and passed by the vote of 17 Aye, 0 Nay, and 0 Absent. The bill will move to the House floor as a Veterans Affairs bill.
- Chairman Holt recognized Representative Gustafson for opening remarks on [HSB 154](#). An Act concerning the display of the POW/MIA flag on public buildings. The bill was moved and passed by the vote of 17 Aye, 0 Nay, and 0 Absent. The bill will move to the House floor as a Veterans Affairs bill.
- Chairman Holt recognized Representative Baxter for opening remarks on [HSB 155](#). An Act concerning the duties of veterans affairs relative to veteran exposure to Agent Orange. The bill was moved and passed by the vote of 17 Aye, 0 Nay, and 0 Absent. The bill will move to the House floor as a Veterans Affairs bill.
- Chairman Holt recognized Representative Salmon for opening remarks on [HSB 157](#). An Act relating to service in the National Guard and Reserve components of the armed forces, including applicability of reemployment protections, and military justice jurisdiction and statutes of limitation. The bill was moved and passed by the vote of 17 Aye, 0 Nay, and 0 Absent. The bill will move to the House floor as a Veterans Affairs bill.
