Representative Carlson (CH) called the committee to order at 2:00 pm.

The committee stood at ease at 2:01 pm for both parties to caucus.

The committee reconvened at 2:30 pm.

The Roll was taken.

The minutes from the previous meeting were approved.

Representative Carlson (CH) recognized Representative Worthan for opening remarks on <u>HSB</u> 139 (A bill for an act relating to the use of electronic communication devices while driving, and making penalties applicable.) Representative Worthan noted there were amendments.

The Chair recognized Representative Olson for opening remarks on amendment <u>HSB 139</u>.844. After discussion, the Chair recognized Representative Olson for closing remarks on amendment <u>HSB 139</u>.844. Representative Olson moved the amendment and requested a roll call vote. The amendment failed with a roll call vote of 8 ayes (Forbes, Cohoon, Finkenauer, Heddens, Jacoby, Olson, Ourth, and Smith, R.) to 13 nays.

The Chair recognized Representative Worthan for opening remarks on amendment <u>HSB</u> 139.883. After discussion, the Chair recognized Representative Worthan for closing remarks on amendment <u>HSB 139</u>.883. Representative Worthan moved the amendment. The amendment was adopted by a voice vote.

The Chair recognized Representative Olson for opening remarks on amendment HSB 139.850. After discussion, the Chair recognized Representative Olson for closing remarks on amendment HSB 139.850. Representative Olson moved the amendment and requested a voice vote. The amendment was not adopted by a voice vote.

The committee was back to consideration of <u>HSB 139</u> as amended. After discussion, the Chair recognized Representative Worthan for closing remarks on <u>HSB 139</u> as amended.

Representative Worthan moved <u>HSB 139</u> as amended. The bill passed with a roll call vote of 20 ayes to 1 nay (Olson). Having received a constitutional majority, the bill will move to the floor as a committee bill.

Representative Carlson (CH) recognized Representative R. Taylor for opening remarks on <u>HSB</u> 75 (A bill for an act establishing a motor vehicle insurance verification program, establishing fees, and including penalty and effective date provisions.) Representative R. Taylor noted there is an amendment.

The Chair recognized Representative R. Taylor for opening remarks on amendment <u>HSB</u> <u>75</u>.872. After discussion, the Chair recognized Representative R. Taylor for closing remarks on amendment <u>HSB 75</u>.872. Representative R. Taylor moved the amendment. The amendment was adopted by a voice vote.

After discussion, the Chair recognized Representative R. Taylor for closing remarks on <u>HSB 75</u> as amended. Representative R. Taylor moved <u>HSB 75</u> as amended. The bill passed with a roll call vote of 14 ayes to 7 nays (Forbes, Cohoon, Heddens, Jacoby, Olson, Ourth, and Smith, R.). Having received a constitutional majority, the bill will move to the floor as a committee bill.

Representative Carlson (CH) recognized Representative R. Taylor for opening remarks on HF 392 (A bill for an act relating to the length of approved driver education courses.) After discussion, the Chair recognized Representative R. Taylor for closing remarks on HF 392. Representative R. Taylor moved HF 392. The bill passed with a roll call vote of 21 ayes to 0 nays. Having received a constitutional majority, the bill will move to the floor as a committee bill.

Representative Carlson (CH) recognized Representative Landon for opening remarks on <u>HSB</u> 167 (A bill for an act relating to insurers in possession of salvage motor vehicles.) After discussion, the Chair recognized Representative Landon for closing remarks on <u>HSB</u> 167. Representative Landon moved <u>HSB</u> 167. The bill passed with a roll call vote of 19 ayes to 0 with two absent or not voting (Finkenauer and Olson). Having received a constitutional majority, the bill will move to the floor as a committee bill.

Representative Carlson (CH) recognized Representative Maxwell for opening remarks on HF 432 (A bill for an act relating to the use of lighted headlamps by certain motor vehicles, and making a penalty applicable.) After discussion, the Chair recognized Representative Maxwell for closing remarks on HF 432. Representative Maxwell moved HF 432. The bill passed with a roll call vote of 17 ayes to 2 nays (Smith, R. and Taylor, R.) with two absent or not voting (Finkenauer and Olson). Having received a constitutional majority, the bill will move to the floor as a committee bill.

As there was no other business to come before the committee, Representative Forbes moved to arise.
