Roll Call was read and a quorum was present.

As there were no corrections, amendments and/or deletions to the March 1, 2017 meeting minutes, they were unanimously approved.

Chairman Fry recognized Representative Holt for opening remarks on [HSB 172](#): A bill for an act relating to oversight of public assistance programs, and including effective date provisions.

The bill moved and passed with the vote of 20 Aye, 0 Nay, and 1 Absent. The bill will move to the House floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.

Chairman Fry recognized Representative Salmon for opening remarks on [HF 112](#): A bill for an act relating to alternative or complementary medicine, including exemptions from disciplinary action for persons licensed to practice health-related professions and a limitation on available damages in a civil action, and including effective date provisions.

The Chair recognized Representative Salmon for opening remarks on Amendment 112.963. The amendment was moved and passed on short form. The bill as amended was moved and passed by the vote 20 Aye, 0 Nay, and 1 Absent. The bill will move to the House floor as a Human Resources Committee bill as amended.

Chairman Fry recognized Representative Lundgren for opening remarks on [HF 322](#): A bill for an act relating to prescribing practitioner registration with the drug prescribing and dispensing information program.

The bill moved and passed with the vote of 20 Aye, 0 Nay, and 1 Absent. The bill will move to the House floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.

As there was no additional business to come before the committee, Representative Bacon moved to adjourn at 3:00 pm.
