Chairman Rogers called the meeting to order at 4:00 P.M.

Roll Call was read and a quorum was present.

The minutes were approved from the previous meeting.

The following bills were assigned:

HF 406 Wheeler – Chair, T. Moore & Steckman

HF 418 Salmon – Chair, T. Moore & Gaines

HF 419 Mommsen – Chair, Wheeler, Breckenridge

The meeting stood at ease for both parties to caucus at 4:05 P.M.

The meeting reconvened at 4:55 P.M.

Representative Fry moved to recess at 5:00 P.M.

The chair reconvened at 5:05 P.M.

The meeting stood at ease for both parties to caucus at 5:10 P.M. The meeting reconvened at 5:45 P.M.

Chairman Rogers recognized Representative Carlin for opening remarks on HF 353. (A bill for an act requiring school districts to establish security plans for school buildings and providing for a school security task force and report.)

The chair recognized Representative Carlin for Amendment 896. After discussion and closing comments, the amendment was moved and passed on short form.

After discussion, the chair recognized Representative Carlin for closing comments on HF 353 as amended. Representative Carlin moved HF 353 as amended. The bill passed by the vote 22 Aye, 0 Nay and 1 Absent. The bill as amended will move to the House floor as an Education Committee bill.

Chairman Rogers recognized Representative Carlin for opening remarks on HSB 107. (A bill for an act relating to computer science education by providing for education standards by the state board of education, for instructor endorsements and authorizations issued by the board of educational examiners, for establishment of a computer science professional development incentive fund, and for the establishment of a computer science education work group.)

The chair recognized Representative R. Smith for opening comments on amendment 745. After discussion and closing comments, the amendment was moved and passed by the vote 22 Aye, 0 Nay and 1 Absent.

The chair recognized Representative R. Smith for Amendment 908.

The meeting stood at east for Republicans to caucus at 6:00 P.M. The meeting reconvened at 6:15 P.M.

The chair asked for unanimous consent to approve Sense Amendment 908, striking the last sentence of amendment 908. (A legislative member is eligible for per diem and expenses as provided in section 2.10.) The sense amendment was approved.

The chair recognized Representative R. Smith for opening comments on Amendment 908 as amended. After discussion and closing comments, the amendment was moved and passed on short form.

After discussion, the chair recognized Representative Carlin for closing comments on <u>HSB 107</u> as amended. Representative Carlin moved <u>HSB 107</u> as amended. The bill as amended passed by the vote 22 Aye, 0 Nay and 1 Absent. The bill as amended will move to the House floor as an Education Committee bill.

The chair recognized Representative Gassman for opening remarks on HF 255. (A bill for an act modifying the membership of the college student aid commission.)

The chair recognized Representative Gassman for Amendment 700. Representative Gassman asked for unanimous consent to divide Amendment 700 into sections A (*lines 1-4*) and B (*lines 5-16*). With no objections amendment 700 was divided into sections A and B.

The chair recognized Representative Gassman for opening comments on amendment 700 division A. After discussion and closing comments, the amendment was moved and passed on voice vote.

The chair recognized Representative Gassman for opening comments on amendment 700 division B. Representative Gassman asked for unanimous consent to withdraw the amendment. With no objections amendment 700 division B was withdrawn.

After discussion, the chair recognized Representative Carlin for closing comments on HF 255 as amended. Representative Carlin moved HSB 107 as amended. The bill as amended passed by the vote 22 Aye, 0 Nay and 1 Absent. The bill as amended will move to the House floor as an Education Committee bill.

The chair recognized Representative Gassman for opening comments on HSB 94. (A bill for an act relating to the registration of postsecondary schools by the college student aid commission and student eligibility for state student financial aid programs.)

The chair recognized Representative Gassman for Amendment 750. After discussion and closing comments, the amendment was moved and passed on short form.

After discussion, the chair recognized Representative Gassman for closing comments on <u>HSB</u> 94 as amended. Representative Gassman moved <u>HSB</u> 94 as amended. The bill as amended was passed by the vote 22 Aye, 0 Nay and 1 Absent. The bill as amended will move to the House floor as an Education Committee bill.

Chairman Rogers conceded the chair to Representative Dolecheck.

Chairman Dolecheck recognized Representative Rogers for opening comments on HF 26. (A bill for an act relating to the exercise, by school districts, of any broad and implied powers not inconsistent with the laws of the general assembly, and to the construction of statutes related to school district boards and school districts.)

The chair recognized Representative Rogers for amendment 912. After discussion and closing comments, the amendment was moved and passed on the vote 13 Aye, 9 Nay, and 1 Absent. The Nay votes were Representatives Steckman, Breckenridge, Brown-Powers, Gaines, Hanson, Mascher, Nielsen, R. Smith, and Staed.

Representative Steckman moved that <u>HF 26</u> be substituted as <u>HJR 3</u> and seconded by Representative Staed.

After discussion, the motion failed on the vote 9 Aye, 13 Nay and 1 Absent. The Aye votes were Representatives Steckman, Breckenridge, Brown-Powers, Gaines, Hanson, Mascher, Nielsen, R. Smith, and Staed.

Representative Nielson asked for unanimous consent to open up the committee for questions and comments to the Department of Education. With an objection from Representative Gassman, the motion was denied.

The meeting stood at ease for both parties to caucus at 7:05 pm. The meeting reconvened at 7:45 P.M.

Representative Steckman requested a fiscal note on the HF 26.

Chair recognized Representative Rogers for closing comments on HF 26 as amended. Representative Rogers moved HF 26 as amended. The bill as amended passed by the vote 13 Ayes, 9 Nays and 1 Absent. The bill as amended will moved to the House floor as an Education Committee bill. The Nay votes were Representatives Steckman, Breckenridge, Brown-Powers, Gaines, Hanson, Mascher, Nielsen, R. Smith, and Staed.

Chairman Dolecheck returned the chair back to Representative Rogers.
As there was no additional business to come before the committee, Representative Gaines moved to adjourn at 8:00 PM.
