Chair Vander Linden recognized Representative Baltimore for opening comments on [HF 494](#), a bill for an act relating to financial crime enforcement by assessing a drug paraphernalia surcharge, creating a money transfer service fee and related fund and income tax credit, and including retroactive applicability provisions. Representative Baltimore introduced Amendment 1327 to [HF 494](#). After discussion, Representative Baltimore moved Amendment 1327 and it passed by voice vote. Following discussion, Chair Vander Linden recognized Representative Baltimore for closing comments on [HF 494](#), as amended. Representative Baltimore moved [HF 494](#), as amended. A record roll call was taken and [HF 494](#), as amended, passed (15-10) (Nays: Jacoby, Bennett, Forbes, Gaskill, Isenhart, Kearns, Kurth, McConkey, Prichard, Wolfe).
