ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE

June 19, 1985

The third meeting of the Administration Committee of the Iowa Legislative Council was called to order at 1:40 p.m. by the Chairman, Senator Donald V. Doyle on Wednesday, June 19, 1985 in Senate Committee Room 22 of the State House, Des Moines, Iowa. Members present in addition to Chairman Doyle were:

Also present during the meeting were Mr. David Fries, State Department of Health, Mr. Thane R. Johnson, Senior Research Analyst, Legislative Service Bureau, other legislative staff, members of the news media, and other interested persons.

Chairman Doyle recognized Senator Hultman who moved to approve the minutes of the meeting of the May 30, 1985 as submitted. The motion was adopted.

Chairman Doyle recognized Mr. Fries, State Department of Health who presented a letter from Ms. Isabelle Wandling, Executive Vice-President of the Iowa Academy of Family Physicians to Mr. Jack Kelly, Iowa Department of Health relating to the "Doctor of the Day" program. In the letter, Ms. Wandling stated that the Board of Directors of the Iowa Academy of Family Physicians voted to discontinue the "Doctor of the Day" program.

In reply to a request by Representative Harbor, Mr. Fries presented a letter from Mr. Jack Kelly to Dr. Wayne E. Rouse, President of the Iowa Academy of Family Physicians. A copy of Mr. Kelly's letter and Ms. Wandling's reply are attached to and by this reference made a part of these minutes.

Senator Hultman stated that in light of the requests of the Academy, no further action should be taken by the Committee.

Senator Coleman requested that the minutes show that the Committee is receptive to reinstatement of a "Doctor of the Day" program if desired by the Academy.
