ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE

OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

June 18, 1992

PRELIMINARY BUSINESS

The Administration Committee of the Legislative Council was called to order at 12:35 p.m. on Thursday, June 18, 1992, by Chairperson Representative Mike Peterson, in Senate Committee Room 24, State Capitol Building, Des Moines, Iowa. Those members of the Committee present in addition to Chairperson Peterson were Senator Don Doyle, Representative Wayne McKinney, and Representative Bill Harbor. Chairperson Peterson received the minutes from the May 19, 1992, meeting.

CODE DATA BASE CONTRACT -- SOCIETY OF LAND SURVEYORS OF IOWA

Chairperson Peterson recognized Mark Johnson, Legislative Service Bureau, for an update on the sale of the Code data base to interested vendors. Mr. Johnson distributed a draft copy of a contract for services for the Committee's review and informed the Committee that the language in the contract would form the basis for the agreement being negotiated with the Society of Land Surveyors of Iowa for a portion of the electronic Code database. Mr. Johnson stated that the Service Bureau recommends a contract price of \$1500 after review of existing contracts and determining the amount of the database which is to be used by the Society. He noted that the contract would be virtually identical to the agreement entered into with Truart Color Graphics.

Senator Doyle asked if the contract would include changes made during the 1992 Session. Mr. Johnson replied that the Society did not want to wait until those changes had been incorporated, and wanted to move forward as quickly as possible. There being no further discussion, Senator Doyle recommended that the Committee request the Legislative Council move and approve the sale of a portion of the electronic Code database pursuant to an agreement to be negotiated and finalized by the Legislative Service Bureau with the Society of Land Surveyors of Iowa, in consultation with, and upon approval of the Chairperson and Vice Chairperson of the Legislative Council. The motion was seconded and approved by the Committee without a quorum.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the Committee, the Committee adjourned at 12:45 p.m.
