LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

May 20, 1981

The third meeting of the 1981-1983 Legislative Council was called to order at 12:25 p.m., Wednesday, May 20, 1981 in Committee Room 22 of the State House, Des Moines. Council members attending were:

Chairperson Hultman called upon Council members to discuss meetings of the Committees on State Government and the Committees on Transportation during the interim between the adjournment of the 1981 regular session and the special session. He suggested that subcommittees of each of these committees, be composed of five members from each house and be authorized to meet in advance of the special session which will occur during the week of June 22nd.

Representative Avenson moved that the Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House, and the majority and minority floor leaders be granted the authority to establish a joint subcommittee composed of members of the House and Senate Committees on Transportation and knowledgeable and interested members of other standing committees to meet for at least three days, and additional days if they are needed, to consider legislation relating to railroad bonding. The meetings would be held after adjournment of the regular session and before the convening of the special session. The motion was adopted on a voice vote.

Senator Junkins moved that a ten-member subcommittee, composed of members of the House and Senate Committees on State Government from both political parties be authorized to meet for two days

prior to the convening of the special session to consider the second redistricting plan proposed by the Legislative Service Bureau. The motion carried.

Representative Avenson moved that the Temporary Redistricting Advisory Commission be authorized to hold one public hearing in Des Moines prior to the convening of the General Assembly in special session to receive testimony on the second redistricting plan proposed by the Legislative Service Bureau. The motion carried.

Representative Avenson moved that the Legislative Council receive the educational leave report which was distributed to Council members. The motion carried.

Chairperson Hultman suggested that the next Legislative Council meeting be held on the day prior to the first day of the special session.

Representative Menke moved that the Legislative Council adjourn. The Council adjourned at 12:30 p.m.
