Chairman Hansen expressed the view that since the Studies Committee meeting had already continued past the time originally set for the convening of the full Council, it would not be feasible to take these proposals up at the present meeting, and at least one more meeting of the Studies Committee should therefore be held for this purpose. There was general agreement with this suggestion.
