The bill moved and passed with a vote of 20 Aye, 0 Nay, and 1 Absent. The bill will move to the House Floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.

Chairwoman Lundgren recognized Representative Osmundson for opening remarks on <u>HSB</u> 183: A bill for an act relating to the integration of Medicaid and health and well kids in Iowa program elgibility, payment, and administrative functions under the department of human services.

The bill moved and passed with a vote of 20 Aye, 0 Nay, and 1 Absent. The bill will move to the House Floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.

Chairwoman Lundgren recognized Representative Bergan for opening remarks on HSB 184: A bill for an act relating to juvenile justice, including provisions relating to child foster care and parent visitation in child in need of assistance proceedings.

The bill moved and passed with a vote of 20 Aye, 0 Nay, and 1 Absent. The bill will move to the House Floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.

Chairwoman Lundgren recognized Representative Meyer, A. for opening remarks on <u>HSB 200</u>: A bill for an act relating to prior authorization for medication-assisted treatment under the Medicaid program.
