Chairman Grassley called the meeting to order at 11:00 A.M.

Roll call was read and there was a quorum present.

The minutes were approved from the previous meeting.

The following bills were assigned:

[HSB 250](#) – Brink (Chair), Kerr, and Mascher

The chair recognized Representative Deyoe for opening comments on [HF 674](#). (*A bill for an act regulating the use of automated traffic law enforcement systems, providing penalties, and including applicability provisions.*)

The chair recognized Representative Deyoe for opening comments on Amendment 1129. After discussion and closing comments, Representative Deyoe moved the amendment and it passed on short form.

After discussion, the chair recognized Representative Deyoe for closing comments on the bill as amended. Representative Deyoe moved the bill as amended and failed on the vote 12 Aye, 11 Nay, and 2 Absent. The nay votes were Representatives Hall, Bearinger, Bennett, Heddens, Mascher, Oldson, Running-Marquardt, Thede, Williams, Winckler, and Wills. The absent members were Representatives Breckenridge and Sexton. The bill as amended failed to pass. It did not receive an affirmative vote of a majority of the committee membership.

Representative Mascher requested a copy of the fiscal note.

The chair recognized Representative Best for opening comments on [HF 673](#). (*A bill for an act to require radon testing and mitigation in public schools and including applicability provisions.*)

After discussion, the chair recognized Representative Best for closing comments on the bill. Representative Best moved the bill and passed on the vote 22 Aye, 1 Nay, and 2 Absent. The nay vote was Representative Wills. The absent members were Representatives Breckenridge and Sexton. The bill will move to the House Floor as an Appropriations Committee bill.

The chair recognized Representative Sorensen for opening comments on [HSB 246](#). (*A bill for an act appropriating federal funds made available from federal block grants and other nonstate sources, allocating portions of federal block grants, and providing procedures if federal funds are more or less than anticipated or if federal block grants are more or less than anticipated.*)

The chair recognized Representative Sorensen for opening comments on Amendment 1163.

After discussion and closing comments, Representative Sorensen moved the amendment and it passed on short form.

After discussion, the chair recognized Representative Sorensen for closing comments on the bill as amended. Representative Sorensen moved the bill as amended and passed on the vote 23 Aye, 0 Nay, and 2 Absent. The absent members were Representatives Breckenridge and Sexton. The bill as amended will move to the House Floor as an Appropriations Committee bill. The committee stood as ease at 11:37 A.M. The committee reconvened at 11:41 A.M. With no further business to come before the committee, Representative Hall moved to arise. The committee adjourned at 11:41 A.M.
