The chair recognized Representative Kerr for opening comments on [HSB 248](#). (*A bill for an act relating to the funding of, the operation of, and appropriation of moneys to the college student aid commission, the department for the blind, the department of education, and the state board of regents, providing for related matters, and including effective date provisions.*)

The chair recognized Representative Kerr for opening comments on Amendment 1286. After discussion and closing comments, Representative Kerr moved the amendment and it passed on short form.

After discussion, the chair recognized Representative Kerr for closing comments on the bill as amended. Representative Kerr moved the bill as amended and passed on the vote 14 Aye, 10 Nay, and 1 Absent. The nay votes were Representatives Hall, Bearinger, Bennett, Heddens, Mascher, Oldson, Running-Marquardt, Thede, Williams, and Winckler. The absent member was Representative Breckenridge. The bill as amended will move to the House Floor as an Appropriations Committee Bill.

The chair recognized Representative Landon for opening comments on [HSB 249](#). (*A bill for an act relating to and making appropriations and related statutory changes involving certain state departments, agencies, funds, and certain other entities, providing for regulatory authority, and other properly related matters.*)

After discussion, the chair recognized Representative Landon for closing comments on the bill. Representative Landon moved the bill and passed on the vote 14 Aye, 10 Nay, and 1 Absent.
