October 14, 1981

The meeting of the Service Committee was called to order at 11:00 a.m., Wednesday, October 14, 1981, in Committee Room 22 of the State House, Des Moines. Committee members present were:

Chairperson Stromer called for a report from Ms. Nichols. Ms. Nichols stated that Ms. Sugar Macaulay, Capitol Tour Guide, has contacted both the Chief Clerk of the House and the Secretary of the Senate about ordering uniforms, and uniforms for the Capitol Tour Guides will be ordered at the same time as uniforms are ordered for the pages. She asked whether the Service Committee wishes tour guides to be on duty during the Japanese Ceremony which will be held Sunday, October 18. It was noted that the duty of the tour guides will not involve payment of overtime compensation. Representative Connors moved that two tour guides be on duty during the Japanese Ceremony. Senator Hutchins seconded the motion, and it carried.

Ms. Nichols distributed a copy of a rough draft of stationery for correspondence of the Capitol Tour Guides. Senator Hutchins moved that the stationery be approved with the removal of any specific individual's name on the stationery. Representative Hansen seconded the motion, and it carried.

Mr. Angrick asked for approval of the Legislative Council for employment of Mr. G. Kent Renegar as Assistant Citizens' Aide/Ombudsman at grade 24, step 1. Representative Hansen moved that the Service Committee recommend approval of the hiring to the Legislative Council. Representative Connors seconded the motion and it carried.

Mr. Angrick asked for authority to make a bid to the United States Association of Ombudsmen to hold the 1982 Annual Conference

of that organization in Des Moines. He stated that the Annual Conference will be held in Minneapolis this fall, and any costs associated with the Annual Conference will be paid for by the Association. Representative Connors moved that the Service Committee recommend to the Legislative Council that the Citizens' Aide be authorized to make a bid for the annual meeting for the fall of 1982 in Des Moines. Senator Hutchins seconded the motion, and it carried.

Representative Hansen moved that the meeting be adjourned at 11:07 a.m. Senator Hutchins seconded the motion, and it carried.
