July 10, 1984

The meeting of the Service Committee of the Legislative Council was called to order at 1:25 p.m. on Tuesday, July 10, 1984, by the Chairperson, Senator C. W. (Bill) Hutchins, in Committee Room 22 of the State House. Members present in addition to the Chairperson were:

Representative Stromer moved that the minutes of the June 12, 1984 Committee Meeting be approved as distributed to Committee members and the motion was adopted. Mr. Garrison, Mr. Prouty, Mr. Angrick, and Ms. Barry, all distributed salary information for their respective employees which listed each employee, the annual salary commencing July 1, 1984, the grade to which the employee is assigned, the step within the grade on which the employee has been placed or the funding required to bring the employee to a step within that grade. Representative Stromer moved that the Service Committee receive the salary schedules as presented by the directors, and the motion was adopted.

Chairperson Hutchins noted that at the June meeting of the Legislative Council, Chairperson Avenson had asked the Service Committee to review the costs of school director district redistricting and make a recommendation to the Legislative Council if adoption of a policy for reimbursement appears warranted. He called for comments from Mr. Gary L. Kaufman who distributed comments of a Memorandum, a copy of which is attached and by this reference made a part of these minutes. Mr. Kaufman indicated that director districts may need to be drawn for about five school districts. He noted that he has listed on his memo the potential expenses which could be assessed to a school district resulting from costs incurred by the Legislative Service Bureau. Chairperson Hutchins asked whether the school districts will be billed for the

expenses incurred. Mr. Kaufman responded that the Legislative Service Bureau will bill the Secretary of State who in turn will bill school districts. The Service Committee determined that adoption of a policy by the Legislative Council does not appear to be necessary. Senator Hulse moved that the Service Committee accept the report of the Legislative Service Bureau, and the motion was adopted.

The Service Committee adjourned at 1:30 p.m.
