SERVICE COMMITTEE

September 29, 1982

The meeting of the Service Committee of the Legislative Council was called to order at 12:50 p.m., Wednesday, September 29, 1982 in Committee Room 22 of the State House, Des Moines. Committee members present were:

Chairperson Stromer called for comments from Mr. Angrick. Mr. Angrick stated that in August, Mr. G. K. Renegar, an Assistant Citizens' Aide/Ombudsman, had resigned and he asked for approval to employ Mr. Clarence Key, Jr. in the same position at Pay Grade 24 and an annual salary of \$17,430.40. Representative Hansen moved that the Committee recommend to the Legislative Council that Mr. Clarence Key, Jr. be employed. Representative Connors seconded the motion, and it carried.

Mr. Angrick also commented that his Legal Analyst, Linda Leon Hoffmann, had taken maternity leave in July, but has indicated that she wishes to resign. He asked for approval to commence a search for a replacement for Ms. Hoffmann as Legal Analyst. Representative Hansen moved that Mr. Angrick be authorized to do so, and Senator Tieden seconded the motion.

Chairperson Stromer called for comments from Mr. Prouty. Mr. Prouty asked for approval to employ Mr. Allan Swainston as a Legislative Fiscal Analyst in the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to fill a vacancy which has existed for some time. He asked that Mr. Swainston be employed at Pay Grade 24 and an annual salary of \$17,810. In response to a question as to why Mr. Swainston is not being employed at the entry salary, Mr. Prouty responded that Mr. Swainston possesses a master's degree and credit hours towards a doctorate. Senator Hutchins moved that the Committee recommend to the Legislative Council that Mr.

Swainston be employed at the stated salary. Senator Tieden seconded the motion, and it carried.

Mr. Garrison, noting the resignation of Mr. Larry Burch, Legal Counsel III, asked for permission that Mr. Scot Beckenbaugh be employed as a Research Analyst I in the Legislative Service Bureau at Pay Grade 24 and an annual salary of \$17,430.40. He noted that he had made a commitment to fill the next legal counsel vacancy with a research analyst in order to restore a balance between legal counsels and research analysts in the Bureau. Representative Hansen moved that the Committee recommend to the Legislative Council that Mr. Beckenbaugh be employed. Representative Connors seconded the motion, and it carried.

The Committee was adjourned at 1:00 p.m.
