Chairwoman Lundgren called the meeting to order at 2:00 pm.

The meeting stood at ease for both parties to caucus at 2:01 pm.

The meeting reconvened at 3:49 pm.

Chairwoman Lundgren recognized Representative Osmundson for opening remarks on [HSB 581](#): *A bill for an act relating to reenrollment following a member's termination from the Iowa health and wellness plan or the dental wellness plan.*

Chairwomen Lundgren recognized Representative Osmundson for opening remarks on amendment [HSB 581](#).2948. The amendment passed on short form. The bill as amended was moved and passed with a vote of 15 Aye, 6 Nay, and 0 Absent (Nay votes were Representatives Wessel-Kroeschell, Anderson, Brown-Powers, Ehlert, James, and Wilburn). The bill will move to the House Floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.

Chairwoman Lundgren recognized Representative Osmundson for opening remarks on [HSB 660](#): *A bill for an act relating to fetal deaths including the disposition of bodily remains, and the filing of a fetal death certificate, and providing penalties.*

The bill moved and passed with a vote of 11 Aye, 10 Nay, and 0 Absent (the Nay votes were Representatives Wessel-Kroeschell, Anderson, Brown-Powers, Derry, Ehlert, Forbes, James, Matson, Sunde, Wilburn). The bill will move to the House Floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.

The chair was turned over to Representative Ann Meyer.

Chairwoman Ann Meyer recognized Representative Lundgren for opening remarks on [HSB 672](#): *A bill for an act relating to informed consent for medication abortions, and providing penalties.*

The bill moved and passed with a vote of 11 Aye, 10 Nay, and 0 Absent (the Nay votes were Representatives Wessel-Kroeschell, Anderson, Brown-Powers, Derry, Ehlert, Forbes, James, Matson, Sunde, Wilburn). The bill will move to the House Floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.

Chairwoman Ann Meyer recognized Representative Lundgren for opening remarks on [HF 2084](#): ***A bill for an act relating to the adoption of the interstate curing disease compact.*** The bill moved and passed with a vote of 11 Aye, 10 Nay, and 0 Absent (the Nay votes were Representatives Wessel-Kroeschell, Anderson, Brown-Powers, Derry, Ehlert, Forbes, James, Matson, Sunde, Wilburn) . The bill will move to the House Floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.

The Chair was turned back over to Representative Lundgren.

Chairwoman Lundgren recognized Representative Dolecheck for opening remarks on [HF 2171](#): ***A bill for an act establishing a child care workforce state matching grants program and fund administered by the early childhood Iowa state board to award matching state grants to eligible communities and making an appropriation.***

The bill moved and passed with a vote of 20 Aye, 1 Nay, and 0 Absent (The Nay vote was Representative Salmon). The bill will move to the House Floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.

Chairwoman Lundgren recognized Representative Bergan for opening remarks on [HF 2187](#): ***A bill for an act exempting certain facilities from electronic prescription transmission requirements and including effective date and retroactive applicability provisions.***

Chairwomen Lundgren recognized Representative Bergan for opening remarks on amendment [HF 2187](#).2917. The amendment passed on short form. The bill as amended was moved and passed with a vote of 21 Aye, 0 Nay, and 0 Absent. The bill will move to the House Floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.

Chairwoman Lundgren recognized Representative Brink for opening remarks on [HF 2215](#): ***A bill for an act relating to Medicaid reimbursement for breast pumps and associated supplies.***

Chairwomen Lundgren recognized Representative Brink for opening remarks on amendment [HF 2215](#).2929. The amendment passed on short form. The bill as amended was moved and passed with a vote of 21 Aye, 0 Nay, and 0 Absent. The bill will move to the House Floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.

Chairwoman Lundgren recognized Representative Fry for opening remarks on [HF 2283](#): ***A bill for an act relating to the organization, composition, meeting, and reporting requirements of health-related commissions, councils, and boards and including transition provisions.***

Chairwomen Lundgren recognized Representative Fry for opening remarks on amendment [HF 2215](#).2929. The amendment passed on short form. The bill as amended was moved and passed with a vote of 12 Aye, 9 Nay, and 0 Absent (the Nay votes were Representatives Wessel-Kroeschell, Anderson, Brown-Powers, Derry, Ehlert, James, Matson, Sunde, Wilburn) . The bill will move to the House Floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.

Chairwoman Lundgren recognized Representative Best for opening remarks on [HF 2378](#): ***A bill for an act establishing an exception to the number of children allowed to be present for child care at any one time in a child development home under certain conditions.***

The bill moved and passed with a vote of 21 Aye, 0 Nay, and 0 Absent. The bill will move to the House Floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.

Chairwoman Lundgren recognized Representative Brink for opening remarks on [HSB 678](#): ***A bill for an act relating to the licensing of abortion facilities, including fees, and providing penalties.***

The bill moved and passed with a vote of 11 Aye, 10 Nay, and 0 Absent (the Nay votes were Representatives Wessel-Kroeschell, Anderson, Brown-Powers, Derry, Ehlert, Forbes, James, Matson, Sunde, Wilburn) . The bill will move to the House Floor as a Human Resources Committee bill.
