Senator Lofgren called the meeting to order. Republicans and Democrats immediately went to caucus. The meeting reconvened at 10:02 AM. Attendance was taken silently by the committee secretary. The minutes of the last meeting were approved. Senator Lofgren asked for a motion to convene a subcommittee of the whole on Senate File 587. Senator Rozenboom moved and a unanimous vote approved. Senator Lofgren recognized Senator Rozenboom as the Chair for Senate File 587. Senator Rozenboom opened the subcommittee for Senate File 587 and gave an overview of the bill. Senator Rozenboom invited members of the public to speak. Leslie Carpenter from Iowa Mental Health Advocacy spoke. Upon no further discussion, Senator Rozenboom moved the bill and record vote was called for. With 12 senators voting Yes and 8 senators voting No, Senators Bolckcom-RM, Celsi, Dotzler, Mathis, Petersen, Ragan, Smith, J., Taylor, T., the bill passed out of subcommittee of the whole. Senator Lofgren entertained a motion to dissolve the subcommittee. Senator Rozenboom moved and a unanimous vote approved.
