On 01/27/2021, Chairwoman Boomingdale called the House Local Government committee to order at 11:30 AM. Roll call was taken with 20 members present (Bloomingdale, Siegrist, Nielsen, Cisneros, Deyoe, Donahue, Dunwell, Gobble, Gustafson, Isenhardt, Kerr, Nordman, Shipley, Thede, Westrich, Wheeler, Winckler, Stead, Abdul-Samad and Hunter) and 1 member excused (Maxwell).

The previous minutes were approved.

[HF 2005](#) was assigned to a subcommittee by Chairwoman Bloomingdale.

Representative Wheeler was assigned as Chair of the subcommittee, along with Representatives Isenhardt and Nordman.

The Committee recessed to caucus at 11:33.

The Committee reconvened at 11:59

Representative Westrich introduced [SF 384](#) and gave opening comments on the bill.

Representative Donahue introduced an amendment to the bill and there was discussion.

Representative Donahue moved Amendment .2673 and asked for a Division and a Record roll call vote.

With a vote of 8 in favor (Representatives Nielson, Abdul Samad, Donahue, Hunter, Isenhardt, Staed, Thede, and Winckler) and 12 against (Representatives Bloomingdale, Siegrist, Cisneros, Deyoe, Dunwell, Gobble, Gustafson, Kerr, Nordman, Shipley, Westrich, and Wheeler) the amendement was rejected by the committee.

The Committee took the first amendment from the table.

The Committee rejected the first amendment by voice vote.

Representative Westrich moved the bill [SF 384](#). Chairwoman Bloomingdale made the motion to move [SF 384](#) and called for the clerk for roll call vote.

The committee voted 16-4 in favor of sending the bill to the floor. The committee voted with 16 in favor (Representatives Bloomingdale, Siegrist, Cisneros, Deyoe, Dunwell, Gobble, Gustafson, Kerr, Nordman, Shipley, Westrich, Wheeler, Nielson, Abdul Samad, Isenhardt, and Winckler) and 4 against (Representatives Donahue, Hunter, Staed, and Thede).
