Senator Kraayenbrink called the meeting to order.

Attendance was taken silently by the committee secretary. The minutes of the last meeting were approved.

Subcommittee assignments were distributed electronically.

Senator Kraayenbrink moved to convene a subcommittee of the whole. A unanimous vote approved.

Senator Kraayenbrink gave opening comments on [SF 94](#). Senator Kraayenbrink opened the floor for comments from the public and members of the lobby. Speaking to [SF 94](#) included: Molly Severn, Governor's Office; Dave Daughton, School Administrators of Iowa; Margaret Buckton, Urban Education Network of Iowa and Rural School Advocates of Iowa; Peter Hird, Iowa Federation of Labor, AFL-CIO; Walt Rogers, Inspired Life.

Senator Kraayenbrink entertained comments from the floor. Senator Petersen was recognized for a question. Seeing no further comments, Senator Kraayenbrink gave closing comments on [SF 94](#) and moved [SF 94](#) be approved and referred to the full appropriations committee. A record vote was requested. The motion was adopted, 12 Senators voting Yea, 6 Senators voting Nay (Petersen, Celsi, Donahue, Dotzler, Giddens, T. Taylor).

Senator Kraayenbrink moved to arise from subcommittee of the whole and return to full committee for consideration of [SF 94](#). The motion passed without objections.

Senator Kraayenbrink called to order the appropriations committee and turned the chair over to Vice-Chair Zumbach. Senator Zumbach recognized Senator Kraayenbrink for opening comments on [SF 94](#). Senator Zumbach entertained comments from the floor. Senators Donahue, Celsi, and Petersen were recognized for comments.

Seeing no further discussion, Senator Zumbach recognized Senator Kraayenbrink for closing comments on [SF 94](#) and moved to approve the bill. A record vote was requested. [SF 94](#) passed, 12 Senators voting Yea, 6 Senators voting Nay (Petersen, Celsi, Donahue, Dotzler, Giddens, T. Taylor). [SF 94](#) moves to the calendar for consideration.

With no further business to come before the committee, Senator Edler moved to adjourn.
