Seeing a quorum, Chair Senator Matt McCoy called the meeting to order at 10:13 a.m. Roll call. Minutes of previous meeting approved as corrected.

Presentation by Commandant Daniel Steen on funding request for Iowa Veterans Home, Marshalltown.

Diane Ackerman, LSA, presented overview of Time 21 bill fund.

Senator Putney wants the Time 21 bill to be as simple -- uncomplicated -- as possible. Senator McCoy requested Senator Putney's original proposal be brought back to the committee as an amendment.

Senator McCoy requested the Department of Transportation to bring back a comparison of what we are currently doing to what is proposed in the part of this bill pertaining to pick-ups.

Senator Putney requested the committee be presented with the fiscal impact of raising registrations for trailers from \$10 - \$20.

Senator McCoy wants recommendation brought to the committee on increasing the cost of salvage titles due to the amount of work involved in preparing them.

Mary Beth Mellick, LSA, presented a summary comparing the House and Senate versions of Title 21.

Senator McCoy will invite the chairs and ranking chairs of the House and Senate Transportation Committees to meet with this committee.

Elizabeth Baird, DOT, will bring recommendations to this committee on registration for antique cars.

Senator McCoy stated the agenda for Thursday, February 21 will have recommendations for registrations for pick-ups and trailers, and for the fee for salvage titles. McCoy requested the DOT bring to the committee what they think is fair and creates parity across the board.
