Senator Schoenjahn called the meeting to order at 4:10 P.M. Minutes were approved from the February 13th meeting.

Senator Schoenjahn recognized Senator Appel to take over the chair. Senator Appel recognized Senator Schoenjahn to take up SSB 3097 an act concerning state and local measures for preparing a student for a career or for postsecondary education, including a statewide core curriculum for school districts and accredited nonpublic schools and a state-designated career information and decision-making system.

Senator Appel called for a Democratic caucus at 4:11 P.M. The meeting reconvened at 4:30 P.M.

Senator Appel recognized Senator McKinley to take up amendment 3097.203. After a brief discussion, a roll call vote was taken: Senators Boettger, Johnson, McKinley, Zaun and Zieman voting aye, Senators Schoenjahn, Appel, Mulder, Beall, Connolly, Heckroth, Quirmbach, Schmitz and Wood voting nay, and Senator Kreiman voting present. The amendment failed.

Senator Appel recognized Senator Zaun to take up amendment 3097.201. After a brief discussion, a roll call vote was taken: Senators Mulder, Boettger, Johnson, McKinley, Zaun and Zieman voting aye, Senators Schoenjahn, Appel, Beall, Connolly, Heckroth, Quirmbach, Schmitz and Wood voting nay, and Senator Kreiman voting present. The amendment failed.

Senator Appel recognized Senator Zaun to take up amendment 3097.708. After a brief discussion, a roll call vote was taken: Senators Mulder, Boettger, Johnson, McKinley, Zaun and Zieman voting aye, Senators Schoenjahn, Appel, Beall, Connolly, Heckroth, Quirmbach, Schmitz and Wood voting nay, and Senator Kreiman voting present. The amendment failed.

Senator Appel recognized Senator Boettger to take up amendment 3097.202. Short form was called and the amendment passed with unanimous consent.

Senator Appel recognized Senator McKinley to take up amendment 3097.709. After a brief discussion, a roll call vote was taken: Senators Mulder, Boettger, Johnson, McKinley, Zaun and Zieman voting aye, Senators Schoenjahn, Appel, Beall, Connolly, Heckroth, Kreiman, Quirmbach, Schmitz and Wood voting nay. The amendment failed.

Senator Appel recognized Senator Johnson to take up amendment 3097.303. After a brief discussion, a roll call vote was taken: Senators Mulder, Boettger, Johnson, McKinley, Zaun and Zieman voting aye, Senators Schoenjahn, Appel, Beall, Connolly, Heckroth, Kreiman, Quirmbach, Schmitz and Wood voting nay. The amendment failed.

Senator Appel recognized Senator McKinley to take up 3097.502. After a brief discussion, a roll call vote was taken: Senators Mulder, Boettger, Johnson, McKinley, Zaun and Zieman voting aye, Senators Schoenjahn, Appel, Beall, Connolly, Heckroth, Kreiman, Quirmbach, Schmitz and Wood voting nay. The amendment failed.

Senator Appel recognized Senator McKinley to take up 3097.504. After a brief

discussion, a roll call vote was taken: Senators Mulder, Boettger, Johnson, McKinley, Zaun and Zieman voting aye, Senators Schoenjahn, Appel, Beall, Connolly, Heckroth, Kreiman, Quirmbach, Schmitz and Wood voting nay. The amendment failed.

Senator Appel recognized Senator Schoenjahn to again take up SSB 3097. After a lengthy discussion, Senator Schoenjahn made closing remarks. A roll call vote was taken: Senators Schoenjahn, Appel, Mulder, Beall, Connolly, Heckroth, Quirmbach, Schmitz and Wood voting aye, Senators Boettger, Johnson, Kreiman, McKinley, Zaun and Zieman voting nay. The bill was passed under Rule 40.

Senator Appel recognized Senator Schoenjahn to resume the Chair. After a brief announcement, Senator Mulder moved to arise at 5:30 P.M.
