Senator Schoenjahn called the meeting to order at 1:05 P.M. Minutes were approved from the February 20th meeting.

The Democrats called for a caucus at 1:11 P.M. The meeting was reconvened at 1:40 P.M. Senator Schoenjahn recognized Senator Appel to assume the chair.

Senator Appel then recognized Senator Schoenjahn to take up SSB 3010, an act relating to the elimination of reporting or data collection requirements related to the department of education. Senator Appel recognized Senator Schoenjahn to take up amendment SSB 3010.501. Following a brief discussion, short form vote was taken on the amendment. Those voting aye: Senator Beall, Schmitz, Quirmbach, Schoenjahn, Appel, Heckroth, Wood, Kreiman, and Connolly. Those voting nay: Senators Zieman, Johnson, McKinley, Zaun, Boettger, and Mulder. The amendment was adopted.

After further discussion on SSB 3010, Senators voted to strike section ten from SSB 3010. Those voting aye: Senators Schoenjahn, Appel, Mulder, Beall, Boettger, Connolly, Heckroth, Kreiman, Quirmbach, Schmitz and Wood. Those voting pass: Senator McKinley. Senator Johnson was absent.

After more discussion on SSB 3010, short form was called. Those voting aye: Senators Schoenjahn, Appel, Mulder, Beall, Boettger, Connolly, Heckroth, Kreiman, Quirmbach, Schmitz, Johnson, Wood and Zieman. Those voting nay: Senators Zaun and McKinley. The bill was moved under Rule 40.

Senator Appel recognized Senator Schoenjahn to assume the chair. Senator Schoenjahn recognized Senator Appel to take up SF 2080, an act establishing health, nutrition, and cardiopulmonary resuscitation certification requirements for students, school districts, and accredited nonpublic schools. Senator Schoenjahn recognized Senator Appel to take up amendment SF 2080.301. The amendment was adopted with unanimous consent.

Senator Appel withdrew amendment SF 2080.203. Following a brief discussion, Senator Zaun moved to defer on SF 2080.

The committee recessed at 2:30 P.M.

The meeting reconvened at 7:35 P.M. Senator Schoenjahn recognized Senator Zaun. Senator Zaun withdrew his deferral on SF 2080.

The Democrats caucused at 7:45 P.M. The meeting reconvened at 7:55 P.M. Senator Schoenjahn recognized Senator Mulder who withdrew his amendment SF 2080.502. Senator Schoenjahn recognized Senator Boettger to take up SF 2080.302. After a brief discussion, short form vote was called. The amendment failed.

Senator Schoenjahn recognized Senator Appel for closing remarks on SF 2080. Short form vote was called. Those voting aye: Senators Schoenjahn, Appel, Mulder, Beall, Connolly, Heckroth, Johnson, Quirmbach, Schmitz, Wood. Those voting nay: Boettger, McKinley, Zaun and Zieman. Senator Kreiman voting present. The bill was moved under Rule 40.
