Rep. Thomas recognized Rep. Kelley for opening remarks on HF 140, a bill for an act relating to local government development activities in cultural and entertainment districts. There was an amendment. At this point the Republicans went to caucus. Following the return of the Republican members, Rep. Kelley spoke on amendment 301. After questions on the amendment, Rep. Kelley moved amendment 301. It passed by voice vote. With no questions on the bill, Rep. Kelley was recognized for closing comments. Rep. Kelley moved HF 140 as amended. The bill passed unanimously as a committee bill as amended. Ayes -20, Nays - 0 Absent - 1.

Rep. Thomas recognized Rep. Steckman for opening remarks on HSB 134 previously deferred. Rep. Thomas asked for unanimous consent to go directly to amendment 501, since opening comments were previously held. There were no objections. With no questions on the amendment, Rep. Steckman moved amendment 501. It passed by voice vote. Following discussion on the bill, Rep. Steckman was recognized for closing comments. Rep. Steckman moved HSB 134as amended. The bill passed unanimously as a committee bill as amended. Ayes - 20, Nays - 0, Absent - 1.
