No bills were assigned at this meeting. Bill discussion... HF 2512 - Chair Mertz asked for and received unanimous consent to consider HF 2512 in a subcommittee of the whole. Chair Mertz then recognized Representative Wenthe for opening comments on <u>HF 2512</u>. Following comments in support of the bill, Representative Wenthe offered closing remarks and moved the bill. Voice vote passed HF 2512 in subcommittee as a whole. Chair Mertz asked for and received unanimous consent to dissolve the subcommittee as a whole and announced that they would return to the full committee. Representative Wenthe then provided opening remarks on <u>HF 2512</u> in full committee. Following discussion, Representative Wenthe provided closing remarks and moved the bill.
