Chairperson Oldson stated that the committee would consider SF 2367. The committee was recessed for caucuses of both parties. The committee reconvened at 6:20 p.m.

Chairperson Oldson recognized Rep. Hunter for consideration of Senate File 236, an act relating to and making appropriations to certain state departments, agencies, funds, and certain other entities, providing for regulatory authority, and other properly related matters, and including effective date and retroactive applicability provisions. Rep. Hunter explained the proposed legislation. Chairperson Oldson stated there were no amendments at this time so the committee would go to discussion of SF 2367. Chairperson Oldson recognized the following representatives for questions and comments: Alons, Heaton, Heddens, Raecker, Alons (2nd time) and Watts. Chairperson Oldson recognized Rep. Hunter for closing remarks on SF 2367. Rep. Hunter moved that SF 2367 be sent to the House calendar for further consideration. Roll was called. Results of the vote were 14 ayes and 11 nays. Those voting aye were Oldson, Wenthe, Bailey, Cohoon, Gayman, Heddens, Hunter, Jacoby, Kressig, Reichert, Swaim, T. Taylor, Winckler and Zirkelbach. Those voting nay were Raecker, Alons, Cownie, De Boef, Dolecheck, Heaton, Huseman, Lukan, Roberts, Watts and Worthan. The motion was adopted and SF 2367 is sent to the House calendar.

Rep. Bailey moved that the committee adjourn at 6:55 p.m.
