Chair Anderson announced that HF 345, having received a constitutional majority would pass to the Floor of the House as an individually sponsored bill.

Chair Anderson recognized Representative Hagenow for opening comments on HF 115. Representative Hagenow was recognized for opening comments on Amendment 115.954. Discussion on Amendment .954 followed. Amendment .954 passed on a voice vote. Discussion on HF 115 followed. Representative Hagenow was recognized for closing comments on HF 115. Representative Hagenow moved HF 115 as amended. HF 115 passed the Judiciary Committee 12-9, those voting nay were Representatives Swaim, Gaines, Lensing, Oldson, Olson, R., Olson, T., Smith, M., Wessel-Kroeschell, and Wolfe. Chair Anderson announced that HF 115, having received a constitutional majority would pass to the Floor of the House as a committee bill.

Chair Anderson announced that HF 36, having received a constitutional majority would pass to the Floor of the House as a committee bill.

Chair Anderson recognized Representative Pearson as temporary chair. Acting Chairperson Pearson recognized Representative Anderson for opening comments on HSB 46. As there was no discussion, Representative Anderson was recognized for closing comments on HSB 46. Representative Anderson moved HSB 46. HSB 46 passed the Judiciary Committee 21-0. Acting Chair Pearson announced that HSB 46, having received a constitutional majority would pass to the Floor of the House as a committee bill.

Chair Anderson asked for unanimous consent to consider HF 200 in place of HF 397. With unanimous consent, Chair Anderson recognized Representative Kaufmann for opening

comments on HF 200. Representative Kaufmann was recognized for opening comments on Amendment 200.1014. Amendment .1014 passed on a voice vote. Following discussion, Representative Kaufmann was recognized for closing comments on HF 200. Representative Kaufmann moved HF 200 as amended. HF 200 passed the Judiciary Committee 21-0. Chair Anderson announced that HF 200, having received a constitutional majority would pass to the Floor of the House as a committee bill.
