



The chair recognized Representative Sands for opening remarks on HF 9. A bill for an act relating to property taxation and local government and school financing by increasing the regular program foundation base, establishing local government financing requirements for essential services, establishing a method for determining property assessment limitations, and including retroactive and other applicability provisions. Representative Sands introduced Amendment 2200. The amendment passed on short form. The bill was moved as amended. The bill passed by the vote of 15 to 10. The Representatives voting Nay were Jacoby, Isenhardt, Kajtazovic, Kearns, Muhlbauer, Oldson, Petersen, Quirk, Thomas and Willems. The bill will move to the house floor as amended as a committee bill.
