...and passengers, was on the bridge at the time; but it got across without serious difficulty. Crossing was interrupted for a little time, but was resumed before night, except in the case of heavy loaded wagons.

VIGILANCE COMMITTEE.—The thieves having given the good people of Lee township considerable trouble, the citizens of that township (outside the city) last Saturday evening organized a Vigilance Committee for the purpose of bringing the marauders to punishment. Twenty-six members joined the committee at once, and about as many more expect to enroll themselves next meeting.

A BRILLIANT SUCCESS.—The concert at Saylorville, held on Saturday evening last under the direction of Mr. Chadwick, was a fine thing, and was well attended. The melodeon was splendidly played, and the vocal piece concerning the capture of Jeff Davis, brought down the house. The speeches were well timed and interesting, and the net sum of sixty dollars was realized, which will go to the improvement of the church building at Saylorville. The Concert was so much of a success, that, by express invitation, it will be repeated on Thursday evening of this week.

ADJOURNMENT.—At one o'clock this morning the Eleventh Session of the General Assembly of the State of Iowa, went splurging down the stream of history in company with other dead bodies. In three months, it killed a wagon load of bills, repealed a sled load of the same article, and scared several corporations of railroad men into conviction fits. It brought out a volume or two of private history, with marginal notes and references, a part of which will be used as campaign documents before the annual election of 1866 shall come off.

It was a very good session after all. The Senate and House of Representatives were made up principally of good men, with more than an average degree of legislative ability.

DEATH OF HON. N. T. BROWN.—N. T. Brown, Representative from Louisa county, died at his boarding place in this city on Sunday morning last at one o'clock. A full report of the action of the Legislature with reference to his death, will be found in another part of this paper. Mr. Brown was a good man, filling his place in society with great usefulness. He had been a resident of Iowa for twenty-four years. He was a faithful public servant, and died at his post. Two weeks ago we saw him; and he was then apparently in good health. The disease of which he died was pneumonia. This is the first case of death in Des Moines of a member of the General Assembly. The remains of Mr. Brown were committed to the grave in the Des Moines Cemetery on Sunday last.




