HELD AT COURT HOUSE, WEDNESDAY, JUNE 8TH. THEODORE KRIEGER ELECTED VICE PRESIDENT.

The Farmers Insurance Association of Chickasaw County met in the courtroom in New Hampton, Iowa, on Wednesday, June 8th.

The attendance was light owing to the fact that the farmers were busy in the fields.

The report of Secretary O. A. McFarland showed the association to be in excellent financial condition, losses for the past year having been light. The report of the auditing committee was then read, approved and ordered placed on file.

Since the association must reincorporate in 1922, the secretary explained the necessity of this meeting, appointing a committee to revise the articles of incorporation for adoption at the next meeting in 1922.

On motion by S. E. Johnston the board of directors were appointed to prepare new articles and by laws.

MRS. VOKES DIED AT FREDERICKSBURG

PIONEER OF COMMUNITY PASSED AWAY ON HER EIGHTY-SEVENTH BIRTHDAY, TUESDAY, JUNE 7, 1921

Mrs. Emmaline A. Vokes, one of the community's highly respected pioneers died last Tuesday night, June 7, 1921, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Clara Padden, on her 87th birthday. She had been ailing for a number of years but the last six weeks she has been a great sufferer and under the care of an experienced nurse.

Emmaline A. Tisdale was born at Ridgeville, Ohio, June 7th, 1834, where her girlhood days were spent and later on moved to Cherry Valley, Ill., where she was married in 1855 to Gilbert J. Tisdale.

Three children were born to this union, Mrs. Calla Muir, who died at an early day, and Mrs. Clara Padden and Herbert S. Tisdale, both of this city. Besides her children she is survived by 16 grandchildren and 22 great grandchildren and a host of other relatives and friends to mourn her passing.

She like many other pioneers was left to raise her family of little ones to manhood and womanhood and they have a rich legacy left them—the memory of a loving mother's guidance and teaching.

She came to this vicinity in the early sixties and in 1876 was united in marriage to Thos. P. Vokes an influential citizen of this city. After his death a number of years later she made her home with her daughter, Mrs. Clara Padden, until called to her final reward.

The funeral was held Thursday afternoon at the M. E. Church, Rev. G. W. Self officiating and interment was made on the family lot in Rose Hill cemetery.
