IN HIS 98TH YEAR**

**Prominent In Business And
Politics**

Funeral At Home Sunday

George D. Harrison, a resident of this community for more than 70 years, died at his home on South Hill at nine o'clock Wednesday morning, March 2nd, after an illness of several weeks. Mr. Harrison was a prominent grain and livestock dealer in this community for many years and built the first grain warehouse in Columbus Junction.

He was born, December 19, 1829 in Philadelphia and came to Iowa soon after his graduation from Antioch college.

In addition to his grain and livestock interests, he was also interested in agriculture and has owned and operated a Louisa farm for many years. He was also interested in banking and was organizer and president of a National Bank, at Atchison, Kansas, in 1872. He also served with distinction two terms in the Iowa legislature.

He was married to Miss Louisiana Ringer, December 19, 1859. She died in 1909.

He is survived by one son, Hal Harrison, of Long Beach, California, who has been with him for several months.

Funeral services will be held at the home on South Hill Sunday afternoon at two o'clock.

A more complete record of Mr. Harrison's long active life will be published next week.
