Demise of Hon. Elmus Day.

At 12:15 last night, occurred the death of Hon. Day, at his home in Sweetland township, his fatal illness dating from last Saturday. The deceased had been a resident of Muscatine county since 1865, and had attained the age of 79 years. In 1871, he was nominated and elected on the Democratic ticket, for Representative and served in the 14th General Assembly. Religiously he was long identified with the Presbyterian church. He was a sterling citizen, highly esteemed by his friends and acquaintances. Two sons and four daughters survive to mourn his loss.
