**DIED:—H. N. Newton** died very unexpectedly at 2 p. m. Wednesday, Oct. 10th. He had been sick for about a week, but was not considered dangerous. He was a little better Tuesday p. m. and slept well till after midnight, Tuesday. His son H. P. returned home from the election, shortly after 1 a. m. Wed. and found his father awake and feeling quite comfortable. In a short time after H. P. returned, the old man was suddenly taken worse with pain in the back, and smothering, and died in his son's arms, within a very few minutes after H. P. had spoken to him and had been assured that he felt better. His disease was neuralgia of the heart or something of that nature. He was 69 years 7 months and 22 days old.

On his 69th birthday a large number of his friends surprised him and presented him with a gold headed cane. We gave a short sketch of his history at that time, part of which we reproduce here.

"H. N. Newton was born in New Hampshire, Feb. 18, 1814. In 1840 he moved to New Haven, Conn., and in 1858 came to Iowa and settled in Lafayette twp. where he resided till he was called on to cross over the river. Was married Jan. 12, 1837, to Miss Mary A. B. Fisk, with whom he lived happily until her death which occurred Dec. 6, 1860. He was elected State Senator in 1874 and served his country with credit to himself, and satisfaction to his constituents. He always took a deep interest in public affairs, and was to be found on the side of right and progress. The funeral occurs to-day (Friday) and is conducted by the Masonic Fraternity. This community has lost an influential member.
