A center piece of red, white and blue electric lights formed to make the letters D. H. C. was a noticeable feature, as were the windows cleverly draped in national colors.

GOODYKOONTZ' DEATH.

Sudden Death of a Well Known Former Resident of This City.

Successful Criminal Lawyer and State Senator From This District.

Hon. Frank M. Goodykoontz died suddenly at his home at Mitchell, South Dakota, on the morning of the 23rd. of an abscess of the brain. He had been sick only three days.

Senator Goodykoontz came here and began to practice law in 1869. He was associated with Judge Wilbur and also was a member at one time of the firm of Goodzoontz, Blythe & Markley. He won a good law practice and became widely recognized as a lawyer. In 1879 he was elected state senator from this district, but resigned after one session and was succeeded by the late Hon. H. G. Parker. He moved to Dakota in 1882, where he attained prominence in political and legal circles. For many years a strong republican, he went with the populists a few years ago and was a prominent candidate for U. S. senator. It is said that he would have been elected had not the republicans voted with the democrats for Senator Kyle.

Many interesting reminiscences of this man, who had more than an ordinary career, are recalled by members of the bar. One is to the effect that in his younger days he defended Frank Miller, accused of the murder of a Mr. Billings, in the district court at Charles City, and cleared him, and that twenty-five years afterward the man on his death bed confessed the crime.
