#### Death of Former Resident

Francis Marion Richey, a former  
resident of Afton died at his home in  
Plattsmouth, Nebr., Saturday, Jan.  
19th 1912. He was born in Franklin  
county, Ohio, in 1841 and came when  
a boy with his father's family to Mar  
ion county, this state. In 1855 with  
the family came to this county and  
settled on a farm two and one half  
miles north of Afton. In after years  
he married Pauline Dickenson, daugh  
ter of A. Dickenson who owned and  
resided on the farm now owned by  
Hon. W. W. Morrow. Soon after  
their marriage they settled in Afton  
and in 1870 he was elected sheriff of  
this county and held the office for  
eight years. In 1879 he moved to  
Plattsmouth, Nebr., where he has re  
sided since. Mrs. Richey died some  
years ago at their home in Platt  
smouth, leaving to the care of the hus  
band and father a family of boys and  
girls which he has raised to manhood  
and womanhood; he never having re  
married. Marion Richey, as he was  
known, was an honorable man, and  
leaves a respected family and a great  
number of old friends in this commu  
nity who greatly mourn his death.
