MORGAN DIES IN KANSAS CITY

Pioneer Newspaperman of Kearney Called to Rest.

Mrs. Guy Pierce received word Wednesday announcing the death of her father, **J. C. Morgan**, who passed away yesterday morning. Mr. Morgan was an old time newspaper man of this city, and thirty-five years ago published the Council Bluffs Daily Globe. He published and edited the Buffalo Courier and also the Kearney Democrat while a resident of this city. Seventy-six years old, he was a veteran of the civil war. He spent the last twenty years in the employ of the government, being connected with the printing department. This position he resigned some time ago when his health began to fail. Mr. Morgan was almost an annual visitor in Kearney and spent a couple of weeks here this year. Two daughters in addition to Mrs. Pierce survive. The funeral will be held in Washington, with interment in Arlington cemetery.

OLD TIME RESIDENT BURIED

Was One of First Publishers of This Community.

The funeral of J. C. Morgan was held from the home of Mrs. Grace Green Sunday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Archdeacon Ware was in charge of the services at the house and the local chapter of the Masons handled the services at the grave. Robert E. French was in charge at these services.

Mr. Morgan was well known to all of the older residents of Kearney, having been closely identified with the early history of the city. His life was devoted to the publishing and printing lines, he having been publisher and editor of several newspapers during a long and active life, and he was identified with Kearney journalism in the early days. We believe that he was also postmaster of Kearney at one time, under a democratic administration, he having been a lifelong democrat.

It is a pleasure to bear testimony to the fact that Mr. Morgan was a publisher, printer, and gentleman of the old school, a man of excellent abilities and honest scruples, who preferred to keep "square" with himself rather than sit in the seats of the mighty.

For quite a number of years prior to his death, and until very recently, Mr. Morgan was connected with the government printing office at Washington, but his annual visits to Kearney to visit with children, grandchildren and old friends, were a mutual pleasure to the visitor and the visited. The Hub will always hold a very kindly remembrance of J. C. Morgan.
