James Henry Millen was born in North Carolina, March 31, 1831. He moved with his parents to Indianola when about ten years old. He was married to Miss Lana E. Wilson in 1848 and to them was born four children, three girls and one boy. They removed to Warren county in 1856 and bought the farm four and one-half miles west of Indianola. In 1861 he enlisted in the 10th Iowa infantry and served until the close of the war. In 1868 he lost his wife and remained a widower for three years when he was married to Mrs. N. J. McCowan, who died about twelve years since. He was one of the charter members of the U. P. church of Indianola, Ia., filling the office of ruling elder in this congregation for a period of thirty years and until his removal from the bounds of same in 1886. He was an honored member of the G. A. R. camp at Bloomington, Ind. He was elected county treasurer of Warren county in 1873 and served two years. Later he was elected representative from Warren county to the Iowa general assembly.

His home has been at Orient, Washington, for the last ten years. He became critically ill on Nov. 3rd. His son who was called by telegram, started back to Iowa with him on the 25th and he passed away on the 26th on the train at Summit, Montana. He is survived by one son, C. C. Millen, and one daughter, Mrs. Eva McIntyre, both of Indianola, and five grand children who mourn his loss.
