

JOHN SPRINGER HURT IN FALL

Suffers Head Injury In Mishap; Remains Unconscious

Mr. John Springer, 85, one of the best known residents of Iowa City, and former newspaper editor here, was seriously injured about 8:30 o'clock this morning when he fell backwards on the steps leading into the Masonic temple.

He was ascending the steps of the temple, where he lives, on his return from breakfast downtown. He received serious head injuries. It was reported at Mercy hospital, where he was taken, that his skull showed no fracture. Mr. Springer was unconscious when taken to the hospital and remained so this afternoon. His two sisters, Mrs. Ida M. Webber of Plankinton, S. D. and Mrs. Cressa B. Hancock of Las Vegas, N. M., have been notified of his condition.

Mr. Springer was co-owner of the Iowa State Press of Iowa City from 1882 to 1894. He is a former printer and is prominent in Masonic circles.

FALL INJURIES ARE FATAL TO OCTOGENARIAN

Former Editor, Legislator
Succumbs at Hospital;
Was Prominent Mason
For Many Years


Death at 5:45 o'clock Monday evening took Mr. John Springer, 86, former editor and legislator, and one of Iowa City's most beloved and best known residents. Mr. Springer failed to regain consciousness after falling backward down the steps of the Masonic temple Monday morning. He had made his home at the temple for several years. Death occurred at Mercy hospital where he was removed following the accident.

Funeral services will be held at 2:30 o'clock tomorrow afternoon in the Masonic temple. The full Masonic service will be held and will be in charge of Dr. W. E. Spence, Master Mason of Iowa City lodge No. 4, A. F. & A. M. The Rev. Edwin E. Voigt, pastor of the First Methodist Episcopal church of which Mr. Springer was a member, will assist. Burial will be in Oakland cemetery.

HONORABLE JOHN SPRINGER

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee appointed to prepare a resolution commemorating the life, character and public services of the late Honorable John Springer of Johnson county, Iowa, beg leave to submit the following:

John Springer was born on November 27, 1850, in Mercersburg, Pennsylvania. He died on March 22, 1937, at Iowa City, Iowa, at the age of eighty-six years.

At an early age Mr. Springer came to Iowa City, Iowa, where he remained until his death. It was here that he established a reputation as a master printer. He made Iowa newspaper history and the history of printing his hobby. He was co-owner of the Iowa State Press of Iowa City for twelve years. Later he was associated with the Economy Advertising Company. Mr. Springer assembled a large collection of volumes illustrative of fine printing and the history of printing. This collection he presented to the State University Library before his death. In 1891 Mr. Springer was elected State Representative and served as a member of the Twenty-fourth General Assembly.

As a public servant, Mr. Springer was actuated only by a sense of duty to the trust that was committed to him. He served his community and his state, and served them well. Iowa has lost a valuable citizen.

Therefore, Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Forty-seventh General Assembly, That the state has lost a valued and

beloved citizen, and the House of Representatives would tender, by this resolution, the sincere and heartfelt sympathy to his beloved family in their sorrow.

HONORABLE T. J. SULLIVAN

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee appointed to prepare resolutions commemorating the life, character and public services of the Honorable T. J. Sullivan, of Clayton county, beg leave to submit the following report:

T. J. Sullivan, was born in Norwich, Connecticut, on August 29, 1851, a son of John and Mary Fitzgerald Sullivan. He moved to Keokuk with his parents in 1856, where he resided a short time, later moving to St. Louis, Missouri, then to McGregor, Iowa in 1861, where he resided until the time of his death, July 17, 1936.

During his early manhood he clerked in wholesale and retail dry goods stores, later purchasing one of the clothing stores in which he was employed. He continued in this business until his retirement in 1895.

He was united in marriage on November 23, 1879, to Miss Anna Korte, who preceded him in death. Two children, Raymond Sullivan, an attorney at New Hampton, Iowa, and Marie Sullivan McDevitt of McGregor, Iowa, mourn the death of their beloved father.

Mr. Sullivan served as a representative from Clayton county in the Twenty-sixth General Assembly. Later serving the city of McGregor as Mayor, member of the board of education, councilman, and justice of the peace.

He was a member of the Catholic church.

He lived a long, honorable and active life and deserved the honors which came to him.






