

FREDERICK D. STEEN, RETIRED FARMER AND ACTIVE MEMBER OF FARM BUREAU SUMMON.

Frederick Detlef Steen, a retired
farmer and active in the work of
the Scott county farm bureau, died
at 11:15 a. m. today at his home,
2229 Jersey Ridge road, Davenport,
after an illness of two months' du-
ration.

Born on June 17, 1856, in Holstein,
Germany, the decedent received his
education in the schools of that coun-
try and when a lad of 16 years he
came to America, directly to Daven-
port, arriving in this city on Dec. 31,
1872. For three years he worked as
a farm hand on a farm near Le-
Claire and later attended Simpson
college at Indianola, Ia. He taught
school for three years in Adair coun-
ty and in 1881 he engaged in farm-
ing for himself on 80 acres of raw
prairie land near Menlo, Guthrie
County, Iowa.

Moved to West Liberty

On April 21, 1881 Mr. Steen was
united in marriage to Miss Mary P.
McCune in Menlo, and last April the
couple celebrated their golden wed-
ding anniversary. After 18 years' re-
sidence near Menlo, Mr. Steen pur-
chased a 240-acre farm near West
Liberty in the year of 1899. This
estate was known as Emenhurst and
was the family home for the next
20 years. In 1919 he retired and mov-
ed to Davenport where he had since
resided.

Mr. Steen was well known through-
out the state, due to his life-long
activity in public affairs. He was an
outstanding leader in virtually every
form of community enterprise which
took place in Guthrie, Muscatine and
Scott counties. From 1892 to 1894 he
served in the Iowa legislature and
was a delegate to more than 20 Re-
publican county and state conventions.
He also served as a delegate to the
Roosevelt Progressive national con-
vention in 1912. He served as town-
ship assessor, school director for a
number of years, officer in several
mutual insurance companies and was
a director in the fair while a resident
of West Liberty.

Mr. Steen served as the first president of the Muscatine county farm bureau and was a director in the Corn Belt Meat Producers' association, legislative agent for the Iowa state grange, president of the Iowa Corn Growers' association for two years, and a member of the extension staff of Iowa State college for five years. In 1914 he was appointed by Governor Clarke on the Iowa commission to the Panama-Pacific international exposition at San Francisco, where he developed the famous "Horn of Plenty," made of corn, which was the chief feature of the Iowa exhibit.

Active in Methodist Church

As a member of the Methodist Episcopal church, Mr. Steen took part in all of the activities of the church. He was especially interested in the 4-H club work of the Scott county farm bureau and served as a city director.

Surviving besides his wife are eight children, George of West Liberty, Blaine of Melfort Sask. Can., Charles of Des Moines, Mrs. Dorothy Leber of Vinton, Iowa, Mrs. H. E. Skell of Maquoketa, Herman of Chicago, Mrs. Helen Huls of St. Cloud, Minn., and Leslie of West Liberty. Twenty-eight grandchildren also survive.

The body was taken to the Alan Clapp chapel. Funeral services will be held at 1 p. m. Saturday at the St. John's M. E. church. Burial will be in the West Liberty cemetery. The family requests that flowers be omitted.—Davenport Banner.

Mr. Steen was a brother-in-law of W. E. McCune of Stuart, Iowa. He formerly lived near _____ and he represented Guthrie county in the legislature in 1892 to 1894.

FREDERICK D. STEEN

Mr. SPEAKER: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Honorable Frederick D. Steen, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

Frederick D. Steen was born in Bohstedt Village near Neumunster, the capitol of Holstein, Germany, on June 17, 1856. He attended school at Loepfien, near Neumunster, for seven years before coming to Iowa in 1872. He also attended school in Scott County, Iowa and received instruction at Simpson College, Indianola, for one year.

In 1875, Frederick Steen moved to Guthrie County with his family. He obtained his first citizenship papers in Davenport in 1877, and final papers were obtained October 1, 1877 at the Guthrie County Court House. He married Mary Perlina McCune on August 2, 1879, and they raised five sons and three daughters.

Mr. Steen engaged in farming, specialized in early hybrid corn strains. He also taught in the Adair and Guthrie County schools. He was a member of the Republican party, and was a Representative from Guthrie County in the Twenty-fourth and Twenty-fifth sessions of the Iowa General Assembly, in 1892 and 1894, respectively. Mr. Steen served Menlo as a member of the school board and also was Beaver Township assessor. He also was a member of the Farmer's Alliance and the Menlo Methodist Church.

Frederick D. Steen passed away at home in Davenport on March 10, 1932. His wife followed him in death. He is now survived by two sons, Herman of Glen Ellyn, Illinois and Leslie of West Liberty, Iowa. His two surviving daughters are Mrs. Clara B. Skott of Middletown, Wisconsin and Mrs. Dorothea Leffler of Fern Park, Florida. Other family includes 28 grandchildren and many great-grandchildren.

Therefore, Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly of Iowa: That in the passing of the Honorable Frederick D. Steen, the state has lost an honored citizen and a faithful and useful public servant, and the House by this resolution would express its appreciation of his service, and tender its sympathy to the members of the family.

Be It Further Resolved: That a copy of this resolution be spread upon the Journal of the House, and that the Chief Clerk be directed to forward an enrolled copy to the family of the deceased.




